Bach Collegium San Diego Announces 2016-17 Season

SAN DIEGO— Bach Collegium San Diego, one of the West Coast's most acclaimed early and Baroque music performance ensemble, announces its 2016–17 season.

"In our fourteenth year, we return to our musical roots by journeying to the very heart of J.S. Bach's music—the cantatas," said Music Director Ruben Valenzuela. "Our programming in October and May represents a cross-section of Bach's development by juxtaposing early cantatas with Leipzig cycle cantatas, while our March program explores the musical language that formed the young Sebastian Bach. Our December presentation of Handel's Messiah rounds out the season, and we look forward to welcoming audiences to what has become a beloved San Diego holiday tradition."

"Bach Collegium San Diego is investing in becoming more sustainable for the future," added Valenzuela. "As we look ahead, we recognize that there are big projects that we want to undertake in the next few years; by presenting four MainStage performances in the upcoming season instead of the five we have presented in recent seasons, we will enable ourselves to grow and embark upon big things in the future."

Bach assumed the post of Cantor of St. Thomas Leipzig in 1723, he achieved the opportunity to realize his artistic aspirations: A Well Regulated Church Music. On the first Sunday after Trinity in 1723, Bach began a self-imposed goal to provide cantatas for most Sundays and feast days of the church year. In all, Bach composed a remarkable five cycles of cantatas, of which three survive. Bach Collegium San Diego opens the 14th Season with cantatas 179 and 42, chronicling Bach's first year in Leipzig.

The span of the 18th century saw a fundamental change of musical language that is demonstrated in two of the greatest composers of the century: J.S. Bach and Franz Joseph Haydn. Bach's cantata, *Erschallet, ihr Lieder* (1714), with its allusions to the Pentecostal wind and fire, serves as the bookend and backdrop to Haydn's monumental *Lord Nelson Mass* (*Missa in Angustiis*, 1798).

Season tickets are \$208 for premium seating and \$133 for general admission seating.

Individual Concerts

Tickets to concerts in October, March, and May are \$50 for premium seats and \$35 for general admission. Senior general admission tickets are \$32. Student tickets are available for \$15, and a valid student ID must be presented at the door.

Tickets for *Messiah* are \$70 for premium seats and \$40 for general admission. Senior general admission tickets to *Messiah* are \$35. Student tickets are available for \$20, and a valid student ID must be presented at the door.

Through its
