AB: Though his name is synonymous with French 23 24 opera, Jules Massenet is a composer who does not turn up on the music stands of symphonic 25 players very often. This is no big surprise 26 27 when you consider that almost his entire output 28 was conceived for the theater in some way, The same could be said of his 29 shape or form. junior Italian contemporary, Giacomo Puccini. 30 In fact, the two works of Massenet that do turn 31 32 up on symphonic programs with any regularity are both taken from his operas. There is, of 33 34 course, the very famous Meditation from his 35 opera Thais. [tah-EESE] And then there's the ballet music which opens this week's broadcast, 36 which comes from the 2nd act of his opera, Le 37 38 Cid. Composed in 1885, Le Cid is based on a literary 39 adaptation of the life and times of Spain's 40 national hero, Don Rodrigo Diaz de Vivar. 41 Classic movie buffs may recall Charleton 42 Heston's portrayal of the character in Anthony 43 44 Mann's 1961 epic, El Cid, which also starred Sophia Loren and featured an amazing soundtrack 45 by Miklos Rosza. 46

47 Massenet's opera was successful at its 48 premiere, but it virtually disappeared from the repertoire by the 1920s. Its ballet music, by 49 50 contrast, has remained a popular concert piece. The music consists of seven dances, each being 51 an example of a different Spanish form and each 52 abundantly tuneful and lyrical. 53 54 (APPLAUSE) AB: ...and we go down to the stage now, at David 55 56 Geffen Hall, for the ballet music from Le Cid 57 by Jules Massenet. Bramwell Tovey conducts...the New York Philharmonic. 58 59 (MUSIC) (APPLAUSE) 60 That was the ballet music from Act II of 61 Massenet's opera, Le Cid.
