30 Conservatory. The piece received its premiere in
31 1913 with the composer as soloist. Reviews were
32 mixed. While some noted the inventiveness of the
33 young composer, many objected to what was then
34 perceived as a "jarring modern sound."

The score to the concerto was actually destroyed in a fire while Prokofiev was on tour in American in 1918. He reconstructed the work from his sketches and re-premiered the piece in Paris on May 8, 1924 with conductor Serge Koussevitzky.

Now considered a masterpiece, the bravura writing and high-voltage pyrotechnics of this concerto have made it a favorite of artists and audiences alike.
