70	After the premiere of the Fifth Symphony, Mahler is
71	reported to have said, "Nobody understood it. I
72	wish I could conduct the first performance fifty
73	years after my death." We might add that Mahler
74	revised this work for the rest of his life. He
75	eventually completed a re-orchestration of the
76	symphony in 1911and died not long thereafter.
