92 Regarding the programmatic nature of this symphony, Tchaikovsky later wrote to a friend 93 quote, "of course my symphony is program music, 94 but it would be impossible to give the program 95 in words. But ought this not always to be the 96 case with a symphony, the most lyrical of 97 musical forms? Ought it not express all those 98 things for which words cannot be found...but 99 which nevertheless arise in the heart and cry 100 out for expression?" 101

102 AB: Tchaikovsky dedicated the Fourth Symphony to
103 Madame von Meck. The first and longest
104 movement forms the emotional core of the piece
105 and we hear the "Fate" motif unfold through
106 powerful fanfares played by the brass and
107 winds:
