- 22 public on Christmas Day, 1806.

- 23 AB: Beethoven's violin concerto is a virtuosic work
- 24 and it is a longer and more demanding piece by
- 25 far than any similar composition to come before

- 29 AB: ...and now we hear the Beethoven Violin Concerto.
- 30 Frank Peter Zimmermann is the soloist...and Alan

- 34 AB: Concerto in D-major for violin and orchestra,
- 35 Op. 61 by Beethoven. The New York Philharmonic
- 36 was led by Alan Gilbert. The soloist was the
- 37 Philharmonic's 2011 Artist-in-Residence, Frank
- 38 Peter Zimmermann.
- 39 AB: We'll hear music that features another of the
- 40 orchestra's former Artists-in-Residence when we
- 41 hear Yefim Bronfman's Grammy-nominated
- 42 performance of the Piano Concerto No. 2 by one-
- time Composer-in-Residence, Magnus Lindberg.
- 44 I'm Alec Baldwin and you're listening to The
- 45 New York Philharmonic This Week.

- 47 AB: During the course of Magnus Lindberg's three-
- 48 year post as the New York Philharmonic's Mary
- 49 and James G. Wallach Composer-in-Residence,
- 50 Philharmonic audiences had the opportunity to
- hear a good cross-section of his work, from
- 52 curtain-raising festive pieces written on
- 53 commission like ExPo:
