23	Stravinsky responded to the commission by
24	creating a new kind of work that combined
25	singing and acrobatic dance. While the
26	performance for the Princesse ultimately fell

27 through, the work was premiered by the famed

28 Ballets Russes in Paris in 1922.

29 The story is based on a Renard the Fox, who is a common character in the folklore of Eastern 30 Europe. Here, the cunning fox begins the story 31 32 dressed in a nun's outfit. He proceeds to play cruel tricks on three different animals-a 33 rooster, a cat and a ram. But then the tables 34 35 are turned and the wily fox meets a most violent end. 36

Musically, the score is noteworthy for its constantly shifting time-signatures and a colorful instrumentation that suggests the barnyard denizens of the story.

AB: The wartime economy influenced not only the 61 modest instrumental forces of Igor Stravinsky's 62 "A Solider's Tale," but also its subject 63 matter. Written in collaboration with the Swiss 64 author C.F. Ramuz, the work employs a narrated 65 dialogue with music, dance, and drama. 66 for a chamber ensemble, the portability of this 67 68 piece makes it part of a genre known as "pocket theater." 69

72 AB: The score calls for three main characters: the 73 Soldier, the Devil, and the Narrator. The music 74 is organized as a series of brief tableauxs.

The plot is a Faustian tale in which the 75 Soldier trades his fiddle to the Devil for a 76 magic book which can provide wealth. He later 77 becomes disillusioned, loses his wealth, and 78 meets the Devil again in a card game. He gets 79 the devil drunk, regains his fiddle, and uses 80 81 it to cure the King's daughter, who has been ill. He then fends off the Devil with his 82 fiddle playing, and marries the Princess. The 83 84 Soldier lives happily until he decides to leave his new town and visit his old home. Once he 85 leaves the safety of his new environs, he is 86 87 captured by the Devil, and must accompany him to Hell. 88

AB: Despite Histoire's Russian inspiration,
Stravinsky made the music as non-Russian as
possible by using materials from North and
South American, Spain, and Germany. The first
performance of "A Soldier's Tale" took place in
Lausanne, Switzerland on September 28, 1918.
