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AB: Philharmonic Associate Conductor Xian Zhang. Ms. Zhang will take the stage shortly and when 25 she does, she'll lead the New York Philharmonic 26 in a performance of the Symphony No. 95 by 27 Joseph Haydn. 28 Haydn spent the better part of 4 decades under 29 30 the employ of Prince Nicholas Esterházy. the Prince died in 1791, his nephew and 31 successor-who was not a music aficionado-32 33 disbanded the music establishment of the court. He then put Haydn on a pension and told hime 34 that he could keep the title of 35 "Kapellmeister," but he was under no further 36 obligation to the Court. This meant that for 37 the first time in a LONG time that Haydn was 38 essentially free to do whatever he wanted. 39 So...he traveled to London at the invitation of 40 the violinist and impresario Johan Peter [PAY-41 ter] Salomon [ZAH-lah-moan] and become the 42 toast of a sophisticated London. Philharmonic 43 program annotator James M. Keller continues the 44 story here: 45

50	written in a minor key and it is also unique

One might 119 not suspect, therefore, that this man possesses 120 an incredibly wide and eclectic repertoire that 121 122 ranges over some eighty concertos, spanning 123 from Haydn to the Martinu we just heard...and into the 21st century. 124

Mr. Ohlsson's many honors include the 1994

Avery Fisher Prize and a Grammy Award in 2008

for the third disc in a continuing series that

will encompass all 32 Beethoven piano sonatas.

157	Moreover, Sibelius demonstrated that one can be
158	original if only he succeeds in transferring to
159	his music his own identity and, by the same
160	token, the identity of his people."

- 165 1899, Sibelius was already a famous man. Works
- like En Saga, the Karelian Suite, the Op. 22
- Legends, and Finlandia propelled him to stardom
- and the Finnish government awarded him an

- 170 contributions to Finnish national culture.
