“The Bible is a book of redemption. It is that or nothing at all. It is not a book of history, science, anthropology or cosmology. It is a book of salvation and deliverance for lost mankind. We are redeemed from the penalty of sin and from the power of Satan and evil by the price Jesus paid on the cross for us; and we are redeemed to a new freedom from sin, to a new relationship with God, and to a new life by the appropriation of that atonement for our sins. The whole of the Bible, whether Old Testament or New, looks to the mighty redemptive atonement of Christ. His blood sacrifice is the ransom paid for our deliverance. He took our sinful nature upon Himself in order that He might satisfy the demands of the Law. His sacrifice is accepted as the payment for the debt the sinner man owes to God, and His death is accepted as the full payment for man’s deliverance. This story is the ‘Scarlet Thread of Redemption’.”
