Powerpoints to Live Your Faith at Work:

- **Create Curiosity**—Too many want to give answers before others have an opportunity to ask questions.

Let your light so shine before men, that they may see your good works and glorify your Father in heaven. MATTHEW 5:16

- **Demonstrate Courtesy**—Treat people with value and respect. Make them friends, not targets.

Through thick and thin, keep your hearts at attention, in adoration before Christ, your Master. Be ready to speak up and tell anyone who asks why you're living the way you are, and always with the utmost courtesy. Keep a clear conscience before God so that when people throw mud at you, none of it will stick. They'll end up realizing that they're the ones who need a bath.

1 PETER 3:15-16 (MSG)

- **Accentuate Consistency**—Do your best and trust God with the rest. Bondservants, be obedient to those who are your masters according to the flesh, with fear and trembling, in sincerity of heart, as to Christ; not with eyeservice, as men-pleasers, but as bondservants of Christ, doing the will of God from the heart . . .

- **Communicate Creatively**

Use your heads as you live and work among outsiders. Don't miss a trick. Make the most of every opportunity. Be gracious in your speech. The goal is to bring out the best in others in a conversation, not put them down, not cut them out. COLOSSIANS 4:5-6 (MSG)

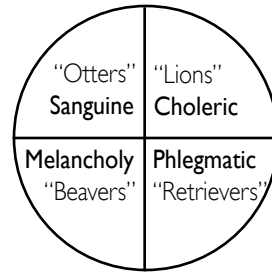
