

## **Minutes**

THE CITY OF TUTTLE COUNCIL MEMBERS MET IN REGULAR WORKSHOP SESSION ON **AUGUST 13, 2018 at 6:00 p.m.** IN THE TUTTLE CITY HALL LOCATED AT 221 W. MAIN STREET.

**CALL TO ORDER** Mayor McLeroy called the meeting to order at 6:01 p.m.

**ROLL CALL** Marble called the roll and declared a quorum present

### **ORDER OF BUSINESS**

1. DISCUSSION and QUESTIONS regarding items on the City Council, Tuttle Public Works Authority Board of Directors, and Tuttle Development Authority Board of Directors consent dockets

**Dickson asked about Ice Cream Festival vendor refunds. Marble stated refunds were for duplicate multi-level marketing businesses or vendors that cancelled their booth.**

**McLeroy asked about Item 4I – School Resource Officer. He asked why the City is giving away City resources by having a full-time officer at the schools. He requested the City be compensated by the school.**

**Perryman stated law requires corresponding benefit to the City and the benefit currently is SRO training is paid for by the school and the City can pull him off the job for other duties when necessary. Those are benefits even though they are not monetary. City Manager and Police Chief had previously decided the resource officer was a good decision in light of the national situation. Perryman stated this was a management decision, and the contract is a council decision.**

**McLeroy stated he does not like the wording in the contract. Dickson stated he likes the investment in the schools and he asked the Police Chief for his opinion. Chief Cluck stated the department is staffed enough to have an officer at the**

**schools. The officer works his regular shift in summer or anytime schools is out, he can be called off the campus when the department requests help, he works criminal activity and he is building a relationship with the students. Hughes stated he does not see the benefit. Littleton stated the benefit is safety, the good will and piece of mind for parents as well as the public perception. Littleton stated he trusts the Police Chief's decision that his department can and should provide a Resource Officer. The Chief stated again that if the officer is needed elsewhere he can be pulled from the school but if the school is paying his salary that flexibility would not be likely.**

- 2.\* PRESENTATION from Clover Partners regarding branding and marketing services for various city services

**Williams and Scrivner presented details about the branding and fiber campaign. They stated two concepts will be developed to choose from. They will provide a concept for rules of use for the brand. They will work on marketing the fiber system by direct mail, email, flyers and posters.**
