Ambulance Subscription Program Open Enrollment

The Tuttle Fire Department provides ambulance service for the City of Tuttle and all of northern Grady County. Tuttle operates three ambulances, allowing us to respond to most medical emergencies within about 5 minutes. The cost of providing medical services continues to increase annually and the same is true with ambulance service. A typical ambulance ride to the nearest hospital will exceed \$1,000. Private medical insurance and Medicare will often cover a majority of the ambulance cost, but the patient quite often will still be responsible for co-pay and deductibles.

For only \$5 a month, the City of Tuttle offers peace of mind. Our ambulance subscription program will cover all out-of-pocket costs for any necessary EMS or ambulance service provided by Tuttle after your insurance has paid. The subscription covers every member of your family living in your house. Most households are already enrolled in the ambulance subscription program and need to take NO action. Anyone interested in enrolling in the ambulance subscription program may do so between May 1st and the close of business May 31st. City Hall Severe Weather Operations

How do I know if City Hall will be open? City Hall is always open during business hours 8 AM to 5 PM, Monday-Friday, excluding holidays. City Hall is also sometimes open in the evenings for public meetings. If staffing and resources allow we will open City Hall after-hours for high-end weather events to provide an option for those in the immediate area who do not have better shelter. It's not open for every storm, and a tornado could occur when it's not open. When we will be open specifically for severe weather we will put a message on the phone at 381-2335 and post to social media as resources allow.

Do I need to come to City Hall? The best tornado shelter is an individual shelter built to FEMA specifications. However, 98% of tornadoes are survivable within the interior room of a well-constructed frame-built home. Mobile homes and vehicles are never good shelter.

When should I go to City Hall? Never try to race a tornado to City Hall at the last minute. Outdoor sirens give less than 15 minute lead time. This is simply not enough time to load everyone up, drive to City Hall, park your car, and run inside even in the most perfect of circumstances. And what if you get caught in a traffic jam and find out the shelter is full or closed? Find a shelter near you now and plan on that when the time comes.

Rules: No animals or pets. Use of tobacco products, e-cigs and vaping is prohibited. No weapons, explosives, alcohol, drugs or dangerous or large items. If you bring children in you must remain with them. Unattended children will be turned over to the Police for their protection. When the doors are closed, they will not be opened again until the threat passes.
