All-in-One Recycling At Home

Republic Services, the City's trash service provider, is proposing to provide curbside recycling to all residential customers in the City of Tuttle. Residential customers will be able to put any accepted, recyclable item inside a separate polycart with a green lid that will be picked up every two weeks. The polycart will be the same size as the existing blue polycart. Nothing will need to be separated. Items likely to be recycled include paper, junk mail, magazines, cardboard, clean pizza boxes, clean glass, clean plastics, aluminum cans, and metals. The cost will be \$3 per month for every residential customer, regardless of participation.
