Deceuninck North America Donates Materials to New Home Built for Family in West Carrollton, Ohio

Company Provided Windows, Decking and Railing to the Project for Family in Need

Monroe, Ohio based-[Deceuninck North America](#) was proud to team up with Habitat for Humanity of Greater Dayton and Catch the Building Spirit for its most recent build, a home in West Carrollton, Ohio, for David and Christy Armstrong and their children. Deceuninck donated the windows, decking and railing, which consisted of white-framed windows and clay/sandstone colored 26 x 12' deck boards complemented by level and stair T-rails, as well as white railing with matching post caps, trip skirts and porch posts.

The project began in late May and was completed in early September. A dedication event was held on Sept. 19 where more than 100 people attended to wish the Armstrongs well in their new home that also included remarks from Habitat for Humanity of Greater Dayton and Catch the Building Spirit. Scott Ricke, building products manager at Deceuninck, also attended.
