Stormwater Runoff Pollution



Stormwater is the water from rain or melting snow that can become "runoff," flowing over the ground surface and returning to lakes and streams.

Stormwater can pick up anything in its path (i.e. dog waste, litter, excess lawn chemicals, leaking engine fluids) and carry it into local waterways.



Do you know what your doggie doo is doing?

When pet waste is left on the ground, rainwater or melted snow washes it into our storm drains and into the Delaware. Our river is used by sailors, fishermen, and kayakers, and it supplies our drinking water. Dog waste does not fertilize the lawn and is a health hazard if not picked up.

Getting the Word Out...



It is a bag dispenser that attaches to your dog's leash! We encourage you to dear up after your pet at home, and everywhere else you go with your best canine friend. Refill packages of these biodegradable bags are available at all major pet supply stores.

What is Your Doggy Doo Doing

When those little presents from our dogs are left on the ground, rainwater or melti snow eventually breaks down all of that s waste and washes it into our storm drain The disease-causing bacteria found in pe waste flows from the storm drains into local streams and into the Christina Riv and White Clay Creek. In addition to contaminating waterways, animal waste like a fertilizer in the water, just as it d land. This promotes excessive aquatic growth that can choke waterways, pro algae blooms, and rob the water of vi oxygen needed by fish.




