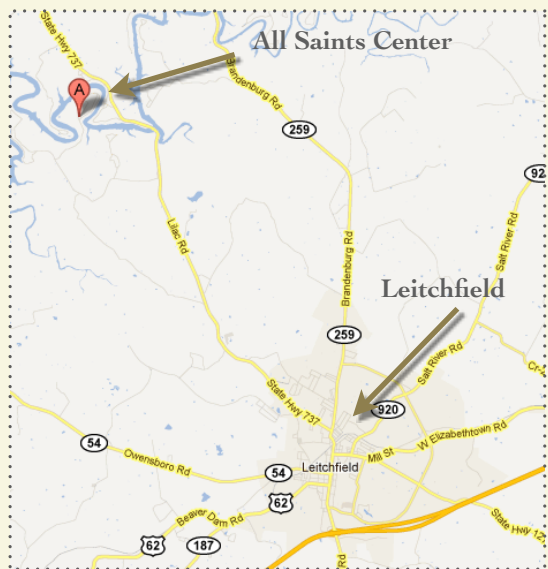




ALL SAINTS RETREAT CENTER

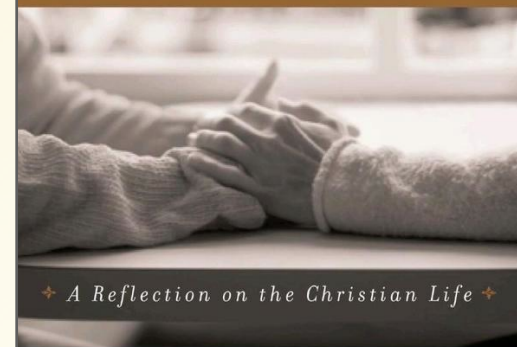

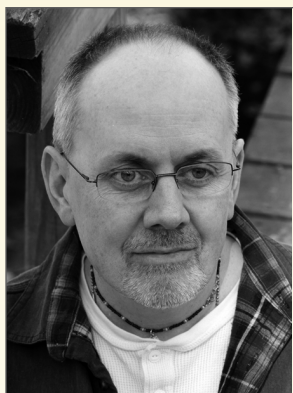
A RETREAT INTO COMPASSION

JOE GRANT

A native of Scotland and former Catholic Missionary, Joe Grant has ministered in Europe, Latin America and the U.S. Joe received his Masters in Divinity from Catholic Theological Union in Chicago. He has lived and worked among indigenous people in

the Brazilian Amazon and served as co-director of a spiritual center for Native Americans in Chicago. Joe is a writer, speaker and program developer for JustFaith Ministries. He is the creator of JusticeWalking (J-Walking), a JustFaith process for high school and college campuses and the developer of Engaging Spirituality, a spiritual-deepening process for adults. Joe writes maintains "Still in the Storm" a spirituality blog for JustFaith. Joe has authored youth ministry publications on prayer, service scripture and justice for St Mary's Press and offered many keynote presentations, workshops and retreats around the country. In 2004 he was recognized with the National Federation for Catholic Youth Ministry award for Gospel Values of Peace and Justice. Joe lives in inner-city Louisville with his wife and three children. Co-founder of Crossroads Ministry, Joe has served as chairperson of this justice-based

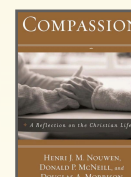
