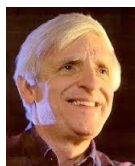

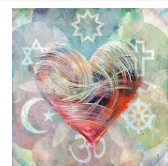
STORYTELLER FORUM - SUNDAY, APRIL 10

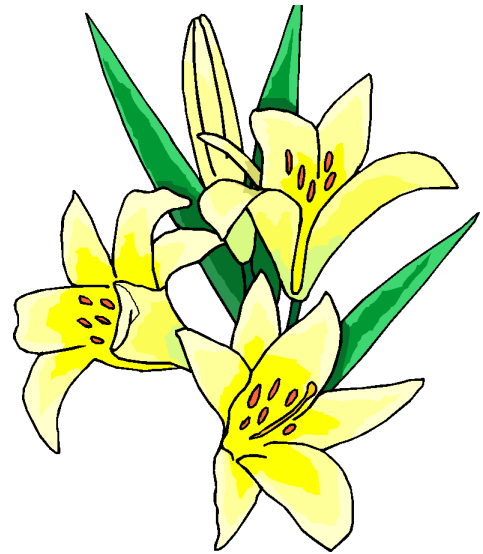

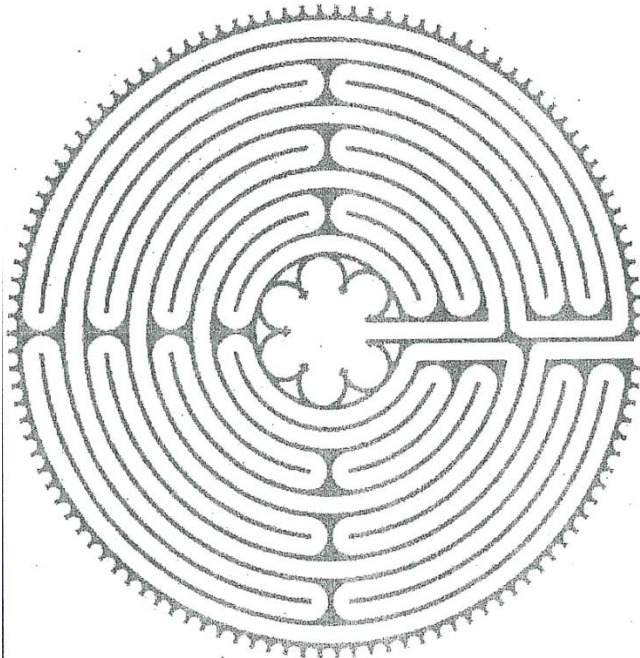
