A Message From Rev. Dr. Wilberforce Mundia

Dear Friends:

It is good to be back in town. I am praying that the Lord has continued to bless you in the month of June through the ministries of our beloved supply priests. I do want to thank the Lord for these wonderful servants. I thank Karen Ladd, our dear Lay Pastoral Leader for coordinating things, and Fr. Lea Powell for stepping in on one Sunday, when my travel plans changed at the end of June. I pray that, as they have blessed us, so will the Lord also pour blessings upon them.

My trip was a most blessed and busy one. Thank you all for your prayers. Thank you, also for those who contributed to the work of Bishop Mundia Academy, a branch of the **Nest Rescue Center** ministry. As we have mentioned before, this is a program Mama Fanny (Fanice) Mundia and I started in order to alleviate some of the dire conditions of orphans and destitute children in a five-mile radius of our home village. The school has become a symbol of hope in the area. The children receive two meals a day and a solid education. In terms of the meals, the emphasis has been on nutritious foods. In terms of academic performance, it is reported that the school performs above average compared to some of the schools around. However, we want it to be not just above average, but a stellar academy. Our objective is that the foundational (primary) education the children receive prepares them to excel and succeed in the future. The school has had such a good reputation that some parents who can afford the expense involved in sending their children to regular (public and private) schools have petitioned the Board of Directors to allow admission of their children to Bp. Mundia Academy. Sometimes, the Kenyan Board has allowed for such students to be admitted at a minimal fee. However, we have cautioned that this step does not disrupt the Vision and Mission of **Nest Rescue Center**.

As of December 2015, the Academy had one Pre-K class, one Kindergarten class, and Standards (Grades) 1 through 6. This has called for greater resources—especially with regard to teachers' salaries and materials like Text Books and other necessary supplies. Both the US Board of Directors and the Kenya Board of Directors of **Nest Rescue Center** have been in significant conversation as to how to handle the need for greater resources. We will update you on the decisions made in the near future.

In general, however, the school is doing extremely well—and it is the pride of the area. I want to thank you for all your prayers and support.

As some of you know, Mama Fanny had some significant medical challenges. I thank God that, over the month of June, I managed to take her to some doctors and they definitely alleviated some of the ailments. I say this in order to thank you for your prayers for her—as we had solicited. God is Good.

As I get back to Pittsboro and our various ministries, I am extremely excited about what is in store. As the summer progresses, in collaboration with our Lay Pastoral Leader and the

various teams, we are looking forward to mapping out the rest of the year and fleshing out our vision for the years 2017 to 2020. I pray that the Lord will guide us all as we pursue our mission of “Seeking God, Serving God, Sharing God.”

May the Lord bless you abundantly as you continue to pursue this vision and mission.

A Message from Karen Ladd, Lay Pastor

Dear St. Bartholomew:

While the nation was rocked with grief last month due to the senseless shootings in Orlando Florida, your parishioners here in Chatham County responded by inviting the community to gather in unity and prayer. Two services, both convened by St. Bartholomew’s folks, were held in the week following the tragedy. As personal stories and prayers were shared, our tears turned into the balm of brother and sisterhood. In our presence to one another, we find God’s love alive and strong, and we become beacons of hope in a broken world. Thank you to Irene Wells and Paul Volk and others who stepped up to the plate and said, “Yes, we need to do something to bring folks together!”

Our spiritual community is so vibrant! I use the word “spiritual” consciously. These are the folks who respond to the love of God in ways that we sometimes do not call “church” but in fact are part of what I call “doing church”. Did you know that for the last few years, two people who are not “members” of the church have come in almost every Tuesday to prepare and serve lunch to whomever shows up? Mac Pullen and Jamie Saunders, both Community Lunch volunteers, saw a need for another meal for people who work at the church or in the church garden. This ministry is an outgrowth of the Tuesday omelet lunches that our friend Nick Meyer began for the Tuesday office workers. Funding for the Tuesday lunches comes from donations directly given to Jamie and Mac, who purchase supplies out of their own pockets. If you are in town on a Tuesday around noon, you are most cordially welcome to join the Tuesday group for a vegetarian meal and great conversation.

We began the Adult Bible Study summer session with a film, “I Am” about how we are all connected at a deep spiritual and energetic level. The film was received so positively, that we have spent the following weeks responding to the theme of the film in our sessions. Thanks to Fr. Lea Powell who led the group in a discussion of “unity”, using Biblical references as well as Fr. Wilber’s *Grapevine* letter. Thanks to Gaines Steer who discussed “Spiritual Synchronicity”, inviting the group to read from a variety of books in an exercise that proved that synchronicity is at work in our spiritual paths. Yes, we are all One in the Spirit, One in the Lord!

If you have not been IN the garden this summer, go IN! Don’t just stop by the gate and look in, GO in! Mike Mannshardt, Gaines Steer, and a group of kids from the YMCA summer camp have created a magical, wondrous place that will make the cockles of your heart purr. (Just in case you don’t know what a cockle of the heart is, it’s the core of your being, according to Webster; I just looked it up!) Many thanks to Gaines and Mike for creating a garden that is alive with Spirit...and also worms! Check out the new worm farm, created with help from Anna Deese! Check out the beehive, built and tended by Gerry Strobe! Check out the vegetable house, built by Mike, where overflow veggies are available for anyone who passes by! Come by on Tuesdays this summer and talk to the YMCA group! Come by on Thursdays and learn some gardening wisdom from Gaines! Don’t just park your car next to the garden, come and experience the magic!

Summer Salad Suppers continue on Wednesday, July 27. You are most welcome to attend, with a potluck salad. This is a discussion group based on the “Go Speak” concept of group sharing that the Diocese of NC has suggested (think small group, think “house church”). We will begin at 6:00 p.m.

Save the date for Songfest on July 20, Wednesday, in the church, at 7:00 p.m. Thanks to Judy Perretti for coordinating musicians for what will be a fun evening.

Save the date for July 13, Wednesday at 7:00 p.m. for a gathering of prayer and sharing facilitated by Paul Volk. Thank you, Paul!

If you come to the church on a Thursday evening this summer or fall, you may see a group of people attending a cooking lesson. Staff

members from UNC and Cornell have collaborated with the Community Lunch to provide CSA's to some local households who are on the SNAP (food stamp) program and who are willing to attend a series of classes on nutritious cooking. The seven households that were chosen from Pittsboro will be able to purchase CSA's from Community Lunch partner farms Piedmont Biofarms and Granite Springs Farm with SNAP and will be followed for two years by nutritionists from the two universities. Nutrition classes for eligible SNAP families will also be held at Church of the Holy Family in Chapel Hill.

Many thanks to all the Sunday school teachers who gave of their time and energy in the 2015-2016 school year to St. Bartholomew's kids. You are the best! Every parent knows that their child is in God's good hands when their kids are with you. To all the adults in the congregation, both women and men: do you love children? Do you think that Sunday School is an important part of a child's spiritual development? If you do, please talk to me about being on the Sunday School Team! Thanks to Judy Perretti, who recently has offered to share her musical gift with the children. Do you have a talent that you could share? Art? Theatre? Games? As a small church family, our children can become more and more comfortable here at the church as they get to know more of us as loving guides.


Free Produce from the Community Garden!

What is the Go Speak Challenge?

These gatherings, part of Go Speak: Sharing Our Faith, were inspired by the challenge to “go deep, go speak and go do” that Bishop Curry issued during the 198th Convention of the Diocese of North Carolina.

As a diocese and in communion with five other dioceses, we took up his challenge to go speak – to share our faith.

At these "Go Speak" gatherings, the goal is to share both a meal and our stories of faith and questioning, struggle and peace, fellowship and loneliness.
