





JR. WARDEN NOTES

- -A Church neighbor has offered to pay for the removal of three dying water oaks that are adjacent to his property but are on the church property. These are located at the fence line in the northwest corner of our property behind the sheds. I asked our member, Dr. Glenn Hughes, to inspect the trees, and he explained that these trees decay from the core. Water oaks live about 80 years. The Vestry has considered and voted to remove these trees at no cost to the parish.
- -We started the process to receive a city permit to prune the old cedar trees behind the church that have snapped branches.
- -The handrails located at the steps to the labyrinth and the rail at the back porch were installed.
- -The Viking ovens were repaired. We ask that heavy cooking pans not be rested on the oven doors.

Music Notes

Are you hesitant to sing the hymns because you don't know the song really well and are afraid you will sing the wrong notes? Then just listen and read the hymn text. By the last verse, you will be singing along beautifully.

Do you think you're tone deaf and have been told that you can't sing? (Research indicates that most tone deafness is correctable with training). Be brave and sing out of tune. Or just read the hymn text and look forward to the day when you are brave enough to sing out-of-tune.

The hymn text comes first and then the musical setting is created to amplify the text. The text matters! Our hymnal is rich beyond measure. Each week, we carefully choose hymns that will amplify the liturgy (pattern of prayers, scripture). Be attentive to the text of hymns during worship and your worship will be deepened.

Research shows that singing, especially singing in a group, produces chemical changes in the brain that result in elevated mood: Music is awash with neurochemical rewards for working up the courage to sing. That rush, or "singer's high," comes in part through a surge of endorphins, which at the same time alleviate pain. When the voices of the singers surrounding me hit my ear, I'm bathed in dopamine, a neurotransmitter in the brain that is associated with feelings of pleasure and alertness. Music lowers cortisol, a chemical that signals levels of stress. Studies have found that people who listened to music before surgery were more relaxed and needed less anesthesia, and afterward they got by with smaller amounts of pain medication. Music also releases serotonin, a neurotransmitter associated with feelings of euphoria and contentment. "Every week when I go to rehearsal," a choral friend told me, "I'm dead tired and don't think I'll make it until 9:30. But then something magic happens and I revive ... it happens almost every time." FINANCIAL UPDATE

Year-to-Date Report: February 2016

Actuals vs. Budget

Tithes, Offerings, etc.: \$75,845.65 \$61,633.34 Expenses: \$51,197.95 \$71,734.20

* At the end of February, the parish was ahead of budget on tithes and offerings. And, the parish was under budget on expenses. Some members give their pledge in one lump sum at the beginning of the year, therefore, the parish typically exceeds budget for "Tithes, Offerings, etc." early in the year.

*You will note that budgeted expenses are higher than budgeted income. Expenses are higher than income because we were budgeted to run a deficit in 2016. The difference comes from our cash reserves (our savings).
