All About Christmas Eve for Children

Our traditional **Christmas Pageant** will take place at the 4:00 service on Christmas Eve. 




What are you reading?

Faithful by Adam Hamilton

We all know the virgin Mary, mother of Jesus! We all know about her sacrifices and about how she was blessed by being chosen to carry our Savior and about how she was a part of Jesus' life until his death. What we don't know much about is Joseph, father of Jesus. There isn't much written about him in the Bible, but what is devoted to him shows his true character. And because of his role, he is no doubt one of the most important people in the story of our salvation - he was Jesus' earthly daddy! Yes, Mary had to deal with shame and a complete redirection of her life, but let's not forget Joseph and all of the selfless acts that he contributed. *Faithful* by Adam Hamilton, does just that! The author revisits the Christmas story, but this time through Joseph's eyes. He takes us on a journey back in time and allows us to understand the complete male dominated climate and the risks and shame that Joseph took by staying with Mary and raising Jesus! From just these few but immeasurably important actions we already are given a glimpse of the heart of Joseph. Adam Hamilton walks us through some suggestions to fill in the blanks about Joseph's life with Jesus by building on what we already know about this great man! Is it possible that Jesus' lessons of treating each other with kindness and forgiveness were a result of imitating his earthly father?! Is it possible that because Joseph respected Mary and gave her value in a male world that Jesus also learned to value women?! So much of our behaviors and habits, good and bad, come from our home life. We watch our parents and how they deal with life and hardships and how they treat people, why would Jesus have been any different?! (Well, besides the fact that He is Jesus! Ha!)



The author wants us to ask ourselves what can we learn from Joseph? What does his life teach us today? I really loved this book, and Adam Hamilton's other "Christmas book", *The Journey*. I love the feeling of being back in the time of Jesus' life on earth. I love the obvious compassion of Joseph. I love that I can look at the Christmas story in a whole new light! This book is a quick, interesting and thought provoking read!

Stewardship of Creation

Ways to green your Advent and Christmas

Many of us would love to find ways we can do some good during the Advent and Christmas seasons. Here are simple ideas that can help you make meaningful and greener choices for your holiday celebrations:

- ④ Look around your house and count the light bulbs. This would be a great project for the kids to help with! How many of them are LEDs? Transition to using more LED lights this year. LED lights are up to 90 % more efficient than incandescent bulbs. LED lights are also safer because they greatly reduce the amount of heat produced, compared to incandescent lights.
- ④ Be aware of single-use plastics, and “throw-away” items that are used only briefly and then go in the garbage, or become litter. Give up the use of as many of these short-lived items as possible. Think less trash! One example: by using plates, glasses and real flatware for your gatherings, you can greatly reduce the amount of trash your household produces.
- ④ When preparing holiday meals, buy local and buy organic. Support Greene Street Market, local

farmers, businesses, and support the organic farming movement.

- ④ For family and friends, make their gift (or one of their gifts) a “surprise envelope” gift. Here’s how this can be done:



1. Select an organization or address a situation where you’ve been made aware of a need. Then in honor of your family member, give a meaningful gift which will help make a difference in the lives of families or children in our community. Perhaps you can even address some specific need of a family or group. Alternately, instead of choosing the recipient yourself, you could let each family member choose the organization to which they would like the donation sent to. Some examples of local places that offer life-changing help are: Second Mile, Boys and Girls Club, New Beginnings School, 1st Stop, The Community Free Clinic, Camp McDowell Scholarship fund. And there are others you will think of. Your neighborhood school principal or teachers may also know of specific needs that could be addressed.
2. Place an envelope on your Christmas tree with a message describing the gift and its recipient(s) and that

this is the person’s gift from you. This can become a tradition that is looked forward to each year.

As we make choices that will contribute to a better world, we all can rejoice in being good stewards of the Creation Jesus came to teach us to love, and we will be showing respect and regard for each other.

May you have a blessed, peaceful Advent and Christmas!


