
#### AFTER HOURS EMERGENCY

## Nativity Outreach in Action

Nativity has been donating funds to the Community Free Dental (Free Dental Clinic) for the past several years. The Free Dental Clinic is a 501 (c) 3 non-profit organization and opened in March of 2013. Its mission is to provide quality free dental care and education to low income, uninsured adult residents of Madison County. Licensed, volunteer dentists from the local community accomplish this mission, although one volunteer dentist travels one day a month from Birmingham. Licensed nurses evaluate and help educate patients in their care and chair side assistants assist the dentists.

Originally, the Free Dental Clinic only served patients with urgent dental needs, which if left untreated would lead to significant pain, lengthy work absences, and overall health decline. Now in addition to extractions of infected teeth and patient education, the clinic provides preventative care as well. This includes head/neck cancer screenings, fillings, cleanings, and fluoride treatments. The Free Dental Clinic also biopsies mouth tumors and readies patients for radiation treatments or other surgeries that require a patient to be clear of infection.

## **GET INVOLVED**

The Community Free Dental Clinic is in need of:

Volunteer dentists, dental assistants and nurses! You can volunteer one afternoon per month, or as your schedule allows. (We would like to offer more services, but right now we are overloaded with extractions.)

**Volunteers** who can process patients and paperwork.

**In-Kind Contributions** Gently used dental equipment Dental supplies Office supplies, tooth brushes – anything we would have to purchase!

The Free Dental Clinic has helped alleviate emergency room visits for those individuals that had painful teeth and those with abscesses in need of antibiotics. The emergency room visit was their only access to care for the infection but did not eliminate the source of the problem. However, the Free Dental Clinic is able to take care of the problem by pulling the decayed tooth.

During a patient's evaluation by nurses, the patient is encouraged concerning medication compliance, smoking cessation, referrals for medical, financial, psychological, and food assistance. Diabetics and those with high blood pressure are educated concerning their health conditions.

The Free Dental Clinic is the only organization in Madison County providing free dental services to residents of Madison County that are 19 years or older with no dental insurance and with income less than 150% of the poverty level are eligible for service. The Free Dental Clinic is located at 2341 Whitesburg Drive, Suite 3, Huntsville, AL 35801.

Examples of how the Free Dental Clinic has changed lives of patients include a number of cancer patients requiring radiation treatment. Their treatment could not begin until their infections caused by their decayed teeth were eliminated. After being treated at the Free Dental Clinic, these patients were able to begin their radiation treatment. Another patient needed a liver transplant but needed her dental issues rectified prior to a transplant. She was treated by the Free Dental Clinic and is being treated at UAB Transplant Center. Since opening its doors in 2013, the Free Dental Clinic has served over 8,000 Madison County residents and has provided nearly \$2.5 million worth of services.

As a member of the Board of Directors of the Free Dental Clinic, I would like to sincerely express my gratitude to Nativity's generous past and present contributions to the Free Dental Clinic.

## Thoughts on Why I Give

Growing up one of my favorite moments on Sunday morning was my mom handing my brother and me

\$2 each to drop in the offertory plate. I felt a moment of pride, of importance, dropping my money into the brass plate as it passed by. I would catch the eye of the usher and beam at him. We talked a lot in our household about how giving, tithing, helped our church help other people, and keep the lights on. When Nick and I joined Church of the Nativity in May 2014 we knew we wanted to give. We agreed it was important and key to helping our church and our walk with Christ. But we were not in a position to "tithe" as biblically defined. Tithing is 10 percent giving. As a young couple, just starting out, it was not in our budget. Frankly, there wasn't even a budget.

First thing we needed to do was build a budget. We use YNAB now (You Need A Budget). One of our first items budgeted is our proportional giving. That is giving a set portion of our income on a regular basis, with the goal of reaching

10 percent eventually. Every year we have increased our giving. It's always an exciting conversation of "Ok, it's time to increase, what are we going to do this year?" It feels like those Sunday mornings of my childhood, watching the brass plate come my way, knowing I get to help our church help other people, and keep the lights on.

Our next step is one we have to constantly look at where can we cut to make sure we are giving back to God what is his. Since our goal is to grow our giving at least yearly we need to be on the lookout for where we can cut to achieve that desired growth. We've changed shopping habits, picked an electric

vehicle for me (it has lower maintenance costs and no gasoline, on top of the Stewardship of Creation goals), and do our best to stick to our meal plan.

For us, proportional giving isn't just a one time discussion, it's an ongoing one. We are constantly moving toward a moving target. Let's give more, let's do more to help grow the Kingdom and help our church be there for our children and our grandchildren.
