

Kentucky Poor People's Campaign holds actions to demand Congressional Representatives embrace resolution to end poverty

WHAT: The Kentucky Poor People's Campaign is holding a news conference at the Mazzoli Building in Louisville to demand that Kentucky Congressional representatives across the state embrace the [Third Reconstruction resolution](#) to end poverty and low wages in this country. Monday, June 7th, Noon, a processional march to the Square at 6th and Jefferson for justice for Breonna Taylor follows the press conference.

Emerging from the pain and organizing power of the 140 million people living in poverty or with low wages in this nation, the congressional resolution for a Third Reconstruction reflects an omnibus vision for a fundamental restructuring of society that lifts from the bottom. The nonpartisan resolution is a response to years of movement building to create the collective resolve necessary to implement real and transformational legislative action. It has been filed in Congress by Representatives Barbara Lee and Pramila Jayapal and currently has over 20 co-sponsors.

WHO: Testifiers and Faith leaders from Louisville, Lexington and Bowling Green

WHEN: Monday, June 7th, 12 Noon, EST

WHERE: Mazzoli Building, 600 Martin Luther King, Jr. Place, Louisville and online at the facebook page of Kentucky Poor People's Campaign.

The 35-minute press conference will be followed by a processional march for Justice for Breonna Taylor to "Injustice Square" at 6th and Jefferson and a brief program at the square.
