Dear Nativity Parishioners,

I am relatively new here at Nativity as I've been a member here for only 4 years; however, it did not take very

long to find out that some areas of the church are difficult (if not impossible) to get to if one is confined to a wheelchair, using a walker or cane, or temporarily incapacitated due to accident or surgery.

Then I found out that a study had been made in 1982 to install an elevator but was never followed through. In May of 2019, Father Michael named me to a committee called the One Body Campaign, to make another study and come up with a plan to make our church accessible to all who wish to worship with us. We spent many hours meeting, in person and on Zoom, discussing what was needed and what was wanted. I believe the plan we came up with is very good. Among other things, it will have an

elevator to serve all floors of our buildings and restrooms will be expanded, remodeled, and made more handicapped friendly.

One thing that is not part of the Accessibility Project, but truly impacts me in one area of accessibility is the new audio/visual system. It can be paired with an app through your smart phone with hearing aids equipped with blue tooth technology. As I am a severely hearing-impaired person, this has been a tremendous help to me and I'm sure it would be to other parishioners who use hearing aids.

With these changes, I know our church can truly be a living example of respecting the dignity of every human being.

I truly believe in this campaign and have made my pledge. As of August 17, 125 units been pledged to the One Body Campaign. If you have not yet made a pledge to the One Body Campaign, PLEASE prayerfully consider it so we can make this dream come true. We are in the 21st century, it is time to bring our church buildings into it!

PLAYGROUND REFRESH NEARING COMPLETION

In early 2021, Father Michael tasked a small group of eager parishioners with reimagining what our children's play space could look like. With inclusivity, accessibility, and engagement in mind, our group set off with a list of requirements for the perfect playground provider. After a thorough request for proposal process and meaningful discussion with the Vestry to secure the necessary funds, the group identified Struthers Recreation (formerly GameTime) to partner with on the project and site prep began in June.

The playground will be an exciting space for children of all ages – even some of you big kids at heart! A main play structure, complete with climbers, a slide, rock wall, and monkey bars will sit in proximity to a bank of swings and merry-go-all. In addition, a set of flower chimes and toddler climber and crawl tube, along with shade structures will round out this inclusive space. Thanks to the generosity of parishioner donations and rollover funding from 2020, we were able to secure high value equipment that will endure frequent play, the elements, and time.

Our new playground will provide a comfortable environment for caregivers to watch over children as they play, and act as a multipurpose space in support of parishioners. Picnic tables, bench seating, and shading will compliment the play pieces and turf surfacing, along with several shrubs, trees, grassy areas, and plants which


keep us true to our Nativity look and feel.

Ahead of equipment delivery, our team has been busy removing the old equipment, relocating shrubs and plants, and reworking the gate system to accommodate our modernized safety and access needs. Andy Cowan has generously taken the lead with site prep and has connected us to integral resources to ensure Struthers can deliver equipment and complete installation with ease. The project is set to be completed in September.

We look forward to opening the space for play and can't wait to see the smiles on the faces of our most precious constituents, our Nativity children!
