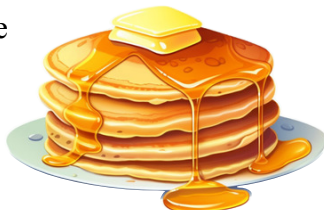

Ash Wednesday, March 5

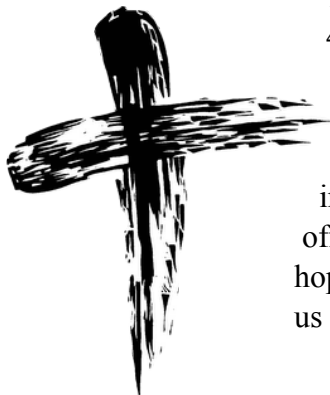
"Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return."

Lent begins on Ash Wednesday, which this year falls on March 5. We will kneel before the altar, have ashes placed on our foreheads, and hear this powerful refrain.

There are three opportunities to worship with us this Ash Wednesday:

12 pm (contemplative),
4:30pm (family-friendly)
7pm (music & choir).

Holy Eucharist and the imposition of ashes will be offered at all 3 services. We hope you can make time to join us at one of these.



Rector's Corner

I am very excited about a new opportunity we're developing to grow deeper in faith together!

Several months ago, All Saints' was invited to be part of a diocesan grant initiative called "Building Bridges, Healing Divides." As a key part of that initiative, everyone in our parish was asked to complete a RenewalWorks Spiritual Life Inventory (SLI) survey.

The results indicated that *"parishioners have an impressive and strong sense of serving their local community. Overall satisfaction with the church and the church leadership is also strong and parishioners are committed and energized by the church opportunities provided."* At the same time, they indicated a real desire for additional spiritual growth opportunities, especially in the areas of "spiritual beliefs and attitudes" and "personal spiritual practices."

Based on these findings, a small group of parish leaders have been working on developing a program that we're calling "**Building Bridges Between Believers**," or "**B4**" (because who doesn't love a good nickname?) to offer opportunities for learning, prayer, and building up Christ-centered spiritual lives.

B4 will ask for a commitment of one year. During that time, all participants will meet monthly in person as a group. This monthly gathering will be a time of connection, formation & reflection, sharing, and prayer. It will include Bible study, a focus on some aspect of Episcopal/Christian doctrine (Grace, the Trinity, the Role of Scripture, the Creeds, etc),

and the introduction of a spiritual practice (contemplative prayer, prayer beads, journaling, etc.).

In addition, participants will be placed in small “Companion circles” to share their walk in faith together, as spiritual companions with one another. Companions agree to connect weekly at some mutually agreeable time and fashion (by phone, in person, via Zoom) for prayer, encouragement, and accountability.

Opportunities to sign up will be available soon, so watch for them! Our first group meeting is scheduled for **Thursday evening, May 15**. If you have any questions or want further information as you discern whether to step into this important, life-giving work, please feel free to contact me; I’d love to speak with you.

Godly Play in March. Godly Play is our education time for our elementary-age students. We meet each **Sunday at 9:00 AM**. We hear the story, wonder, work with materials in the room, feast and pray together. Come join us! March stories are:

March 30—No class (Spring Break).

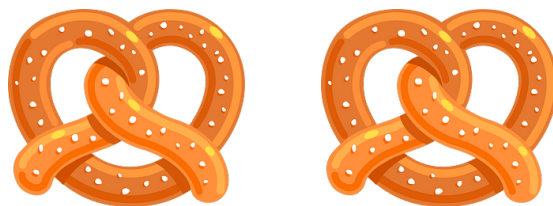
Youth Class during Lent. The youth class during March and early April will be exploring various Prayer Practices on **Sundays at 9:00 AM**. Come try meditation, walking the labyrinth, making and using prayer beads, *lectio divina*, and more. Anyone in grades 6-12 is welcome to join us in the loft, including visitors. (Note: no class on March 30 for Spring Break.)

Burning Palms, March 2. On this Sunday before Lent begins, we invite all ages to join us for the Godly Play story of the Mystery of Easter, to be followed by burning last year’s palms to make ashes for Ash Wednesday. You can bring your dried out palms from last year’s Palm Sunday and burn them to be used for the ashes. Meet in the multi-purpose room at 9:10 AM and bring your coat! All ages are invited to participate. You can also pick up your Lent at Home bags on this Sunday.

Family Ash Wednesday service, 4:30 PM, March 5. This family-friendly service for Ash Wednesday includes the imposition of ashes. Open to all ages.

Pretzels, March 9. On this first Sunday in Lent, the Godly Play and Youth classes will be making pretzels for us to eat at Coffee Hour! Meet in the parish hall at 9:00 AM.

The story goes that in the Middle Ages, a couple of monks made bread during Lent without lard, butter, eggs or milk—all of which come from animals and were forbidden, along with meat, during Lent. (This is also why we eat pancakes on the night before Lent begins, to use up the butter and eggs and milk.) The bread was shaped as “little arms praying” to remind us to pray more during Lent, and the traditional shape which has three holes reminds us of the Trinity.



Here at All Saints’ the Sunday school classes continue the tradition of Pretzels for Lent; making them one Sunday during class time and sharing them during coffee hour.

We do need dough and adult participation with this activity, so please sign up on the sheet in the narthex; recipes are available there, too.

Making Easter baskets in March. Any children, youth, parents, or other adults who would like to help make the paper baskets for residents of a local retirement home, we will have basket-making parties on Sundays in March, following both services. A table will be set up in the parish hall during Coffee Hour to work on the baskets. Our target is 100 baskets! Come make a few! All crafting abilities welcome!



Youth-Senior Tea, Saturday, March 22. Our “regular” March Youth Group gathering will be the Spring Youth-Senior Tea on Saturday, March 22. All youth in grades 6-12 who are participating with the Tea, should be at church by 10:00 AM to set up and prepare the food. The Tea is from 12 noon to 2 PM, and we should be done with clean up about 2:30.

Elder parishioners invited will be receiving their invitations soon; if you do not receive an invitation but would like to attend, please call the church office.

Candy needed for Easter Egg Hunt and senior baskets. We are now collecting donations of wrapped candy for the Easter Egg Hunt and the senior baskets. Please no bags of loose jelly beans or malt balls, we can’t use them. Please bring the candy to the church office, or give to Theresa, **no later than Sunday, April 13**, as we are stuffing the eggs and baskets that week.

Save the Date: VBS is July 14-18, 2025! Our theme for next summer’s Vacation Bible School at All Saints’ is ***“The Great Family.”*** We will be exploring how the church is a family and how we create that community and build those relationships. VBS will be held 9 AM to noon, Monday through Friday, and is open to campers age 4 up through 6th grade (just finished 5th grade).

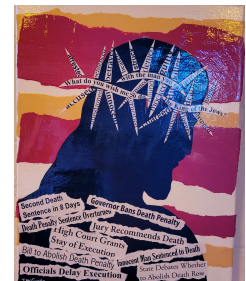
Lent-At-Home Bags

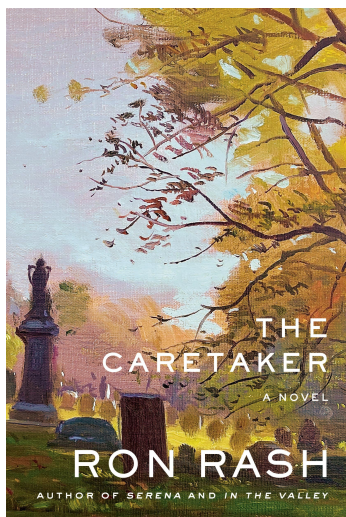

All Saints’ Book Group

Our next book to read is *The Caretaker: A Novel*, by Ron Rash. This riveting 2024 book deals with themes of duty, family, honor, friendship, and love.

Blowing Rock, North Carolina, 1951. Blackburn Gant, his life irrevocably altered by a childhood case of polio, seems condemned to spend his life among the dead as the sole caretaker of a hilltop cemetery. It suits his withdrawn personality, and the inexplicable



occurrences that happen from time to time rattle him less than interactions with the living. But when his only friend, the kind but impulsive Jacob Hampton, is conscripted to serve overseas, Blackburn is charged with caring for Jacob’s young wife, Naomi, as well.

Jacob and Naomi’s elopement has scandalized the community and angered Jacob’s parents. Shunned by the townsfolk for their differences, and equally fearful that Jacob may never come home from the war, Blackburn and Naomi grow closer, even as a stunning betrayal shatters familial bonds.

We will meet to discuss the book on **Tuesday, April 8**, beginning at 6:00 PM with a potluck dinner. We will meet in the parish hall. Anyone is welcome to join in!

Outreach Focus for March: World Relief Tri-Cities

World Relief was notified that federal funding supporting resettled refugees in the U.S. has been suspended. This means families who have been promised refuge and life-saving services in our communities are now at risk of going hungry and homeless. Donations are needed to bring support to the active clients of Tri-Cities Word Relief and the 69 recently arrived refugees.

Items needed: toilet paper, paper towels, diapers, pots & pans, utensils, bakeware, mixing bowls, towels, bedding (twin & full), winter coats, hats, gloves, furniture (lamps, end tables, dining table/chairs, small dressers), cleaning supplies (dish soap, cleanser, mop, broom, trash bags), and personal care items (toothbrush/paste, soap, lotion, deodorant, shampoo, etc.). Cleaning and personal care items must be new; all other items may be gently used. An expanded donation list is available in the narthex.

The box for donations will be available in the narthex through the month of March. Thank you for supporting our refugee neighbors!

Pavilion Update

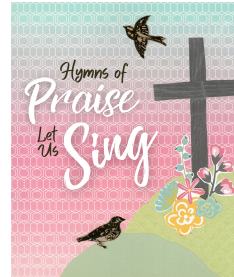

Easter Bulletin Covers

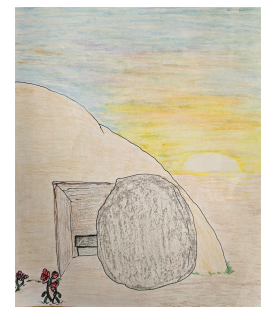
