Fall Bible Studies

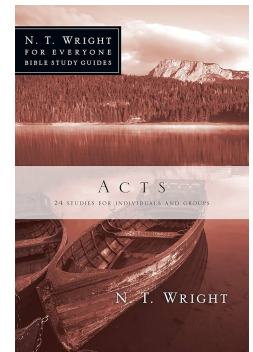

Monday Bible study will resume on **September 8 at 1pm** in the Multi Purpose room. We will be studying the book of Acts, using a book by N.T.

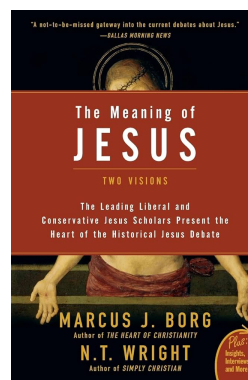

Tuesday Bible Study

We are starting up our Tuesday Bible Study at All Saints' on **September 9 at 1 pm**, in the multipurpose room, led by Jan Wells. We will be studying *The Meaning of Jesus - Two Visions* written by Marcus Borg and N.T. Wright. All are welcome to join us in this study. Please note that we are continuing this study that we started last spring. For all members of the group, we are starting with Part V, Chapter 9.



The Meaning of Jesus - Two Visions is by two leading biblical scholars, one liberal and one conservative. They present sometimes very different views of the Historical Jesus Debate. We have found ourselves agreeing, disagreeing, and often having interesting discussions about who this Jesus was and what he was doing and saying.

Rector's Corner

The rhythm of summertime is usually different than the rest of the year - a little slower-paced, with time for a bit of breathing space. This year at All Saints' hasn't seemed to follow that pattern. We've been busy! Our church grounds have seen a whole lot of attention in the last few months: replacement of the weather-beaten, inefficient windows in the office wing; major repairs to our organ; and perhaps most visible, construction of the Memorial Pavilion and improved lighting for the playground and yard. And we're not quite done. In the coming weeks, the parking lot will be repaired and repaved, and property security will be improved with outside cameras and updated door locks and keys.



These tangible improvements are not the only things we've been up to. In addition to developing and renewing our usual Formation opportunities (Christian Ed for all ages, Youth Group, and the fall Inquirers' Class), we have been working on "Building Bridges Between Believers."

Our "B4" program seeks to combine monthly opportunities for learning and spiritual practice, with small group connections and mutual prayer. We hope to develop connections with one another, as we learn to recognize the connections between our lives and work and the roots of our faith. All this takes time, effort, and prayer from many people in order to come together.

In other words, we have been busy growing, inside and out.

The thing is, people usually think "growing" simply means increasing the size of the congregation, and sometimes it does. We have added some new faces to our congregation, and we have increased the facilities in our physical plant. However, "growth" in a life of faith means far more than a numbers game. I think it's more like what Elizabeth Barrett Browning expressed in her famous sonnet:

*How do I love thee? Let me count the ways.
I love thee to the depth and breadth and height
My soul can reach, when feeling out of sight
For the ends of being and ideal grace.*

Imagine growing in God's love as a 3-dimensional thing. Think of "depth" as our relationship with Jesus, with the Holy Spirit anchored more and more within us over time; "breadth" as building godly relationships with our neighbors in community, an ever-widening circle; and "height" as expanding the Body of Christ in our congregation.

Those are good ways indeed to be busy.

Adult Formation

September 7 is the beginning of our program year! Christian Formation for all ages will be held each Sunday between services. As we often do, we will kick off with a combined Godly Play time for all ages. This year we will listen and wonder with "Jesus and the Women," which is a new story for us!

On **September 14**, we'll resume our practice of meeting in the library each week around 9:15. That day we will spend some time catching up, reflect on what we have learned and think about where we'd like to go deeper in the year ahead. Then we'll begin a series delving into "Transforming Questions."

This is a course designed to help both new Christians and longtime churchgoers move into deeper life in Christ. Over the course of these sessions, participants

engage some basic questions of the Christian faith through a combination of teaching and conversation.

- Sep 7: All Ages Godly Play
Jesus and the Women
- Sep 14: “Can we question our faith?”
- Sep 21: “Who is Jesus?”
- Sep 28: “Why did Jesus have to die?”
- Oct 5: “What do we have to do to be a Christian?”

Children and Youth Ministries: September 2025

Back to Sunday School for all ages!

Welcome back to Sunday School on **September 7!** Our first day of the new school year will be a combined session, with adults, teens, and younger kids meeting in the multi-purpose room at **9am** for the Godly Play story of “Jesus and the Women.” This is a new story for us! There will be art response materials available for all ages following the wondering, and we will end together with “feast.”

After this first day, Godly Play for children in preschool and elementary school, meets in the classroom on Sunday mornings from 9 to 10 AM. Our Godly Play stories for the rest of September are:

Youth Class in September: Our Sunday morning education class for youth in grades 6-12 will resume meeting in the loft on **September 14**. The first two weeks we will spend some time getting to know each other. This is the perfect time for all young people in middle and high school to come join our class, 9 - 10am on Sundays.

Children’s Chapel: Children’s Chapel/STAR Time meets year-round at the beginning of the 10:15 service in the multi-purpose room downstairs, and is open to all children, including visitors, up through 6th grade. We have a child-friendly Liturgy of the Word when we listen to the same Gospel reading as upstairs, and have a chance to discuss or reflect on it, with prayer time, and then some play time. We come upstairs to join the rest of the congregation for Holy Communion. Parents should sign in their child(ren) each week.

We are looking for one more volunteer to lead Children’s Chapel. With eight leaders, each one serves one Sunday a month, working in pairs. Materials are given to lead the discussions and activities, and you would be paired with an experienced Chapel leader. The B4 Project is a chance for adults and older teens to deepen your faith, learn about core Christian

teachings, and form lasting connections within our community. Whether you're new to the faith or a longtime believer, this is a year of growth, prayer, and fellowship.

Each month, we'll come together as a large group for a shared meal, reflection on Christian doctrine, and the introduction of a spiritual discipline to practice in the month ahead.

Each week, small groups of 3-4 (Companion Circles) will meet to share your walk in faith, offer prayer and encouragement, and hold each other accountable.

Participants will be assigned to a Companion Circle at that first meeting on Sep. 9, if desired. You can also just attend the monthly large group meetings if that is easier for your schedule!

The Great Church Re-Keying

The keys, they are a-changing! It's official: on **Friday, October 3**, All Saints' will be changing our locks! It has been many, many years - decades! - since this was done; so many that we honestly don't know anymore who has keys and how many of them are out there. It seems a prudent time to update.

As you might imagine, this has taken careful planning. Between all the exterior doors, offices, and classrooms, there are a lot of locks to take into account! Junior Warden Linda Munson and Bruce Schmoetzer spent quite a bit of time over the last several months working out the details, getting estimates, and recommending a locksmith for vestry approval. In addition to changing locks, a couple of problematic door latches and/or crash bars will also be repaired or replaced.

Now that we have a date, we can work to make sure that keys are available to everyone who needs to gain access after hours— staff and parish leaders, as well as outside groups who use All Saints' facilities.

Please watch for announcements, both on Sunday and in the Wednesday Word, for specifics. We hope to make this process as smooth as possible.

There is no need at this time to call the office to request a copy! We'll make sure you have the opportunity to do so. As always, if you have any questions please talk with Rev. Jane, Linda, or any member of the vestry.



Jr. Warden's Report

At last the pavilion is finished except for a few punch list items! The new cross walk and lane markings were painted by the Boy Scout Troop led by Caleb Berry and Colin Thomas as a fundraiser. The pavilion project has had its final inspection. We hope that by the time you read this you are enjoying it!

A special thanks to all who worked on furnishings, our portions of the work, advice on landscaping, etc. Our work is not all done but the pavilion is usable, as we put the finishing touches on it.

You will also notice that we now have concrete curbing in place of the timbers around the playground and additional curbing to support plantings around the pavilion.

The Vestry has allocated funds from the Bradley estate to resurface the parking lot and that will be done starting September 22 and should be finished before the week is over. Areas of the parking lot are in such bad shape that they cannot be satisfactorily resurfaced and the entire parking lot will be removed and replaced. During that time our neighbors at Anthology Event Center will keep the gate open and the only off street parking will be there. (See pg. 6 for more info)

We have had some unfortunate incidents of gang graffiti on the playground and dumpster in the last month. At the suggestion of the Richland Police department we have added motion sensor lights to the pavilion. Cameras and associated signage are coming soon.

Join us for our **Ministry Fair on Sunday, September 28**, and explore ways to get active in the community outside our parish.

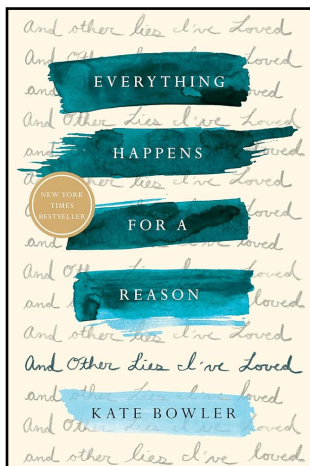

The Book Group will meet on **Tuesday, September 30** at 6pm to discuss *Everything Happens for a Reason: And Other Lies I've Loved*, by Kate Bowler. This book is an autobiography of sorts, where Kate tells her story of being diagnosed with stage IV colon cancer at age 35, with a thriving career, wonderful marriage, and a newborn son.

Kate is a professor at Duke Divinity School specializing in the study of the prosperity gospel, that sees fortune as a blessing from God and misfortune as a mark of God's disapproval. She is very sick, and no amount of positive thinking or prayer will shrink her tumors.



What does it mean to die, she wonders, in a society that insists that everything happens for a reason? Her frank and funny observations teach her (and us) how to live.
