FACTUAL BASIS & LEGAL ARGUMENT

Factual Basis

Kara Millsaps Price, a Rockingham County resident domiciled within Senate District 26, was eligible to vote in the March 2026 primary election to select Republican candidates for the upcoming 2026 general election. Mrs. Price was, however, forced to vote a provisional ballot and her vote was not counted.

Mrs. Price and her husband, James Brian Price, are both registered Republicans and have been consistent voters in North Carolina for the last twenty-four years. *See* Exhibits A and B (voter histories). They voted in Forsyth County from 2002–2008 and then in Guilford County from 2010–2024. *Id.* In late 2024, the couple moved from Summerfield (Guilford County) to a new home in Madison (Rockingham County). *See* Exhibits C and D (Declarations of Kara Millsaps Price and James Brian Price, respectively)

In late 2024, the couple completed NC Voter Registration Applications to change their voter registration from Guilford County to Rockingham County. They mailed the applications in the same envelope.

In August 2025, Ms. Price made an in-person visit to the DMV to renew her drivers license and update her address to her new Rockingham County residence. At the DMV, she was asked whether she would like to update her voter registration. Despite knowing she had earlier mailed her voter registration form, she instructed the DMV staff to proceed with updating her voter registration as well.

The couple presented to vote in Rockingham County on primary election day (March 3, 2026). Mr. Price's registration change had been properly processed, and he was allowed to vote without incident. However, unexpectedly, Mrs. Price was informed that she was not registered in Rockingham County and therefore, could not vote there. She was told she was registered to vote in Guilford County. Mrs. Price even presented her driver license that showed her Rockingham County address. Knowing she had attempted twice to update her registration (once via mail and once in person at the DMV) and believing this must be a mistake (as she was a resident of Rockingham County), Mrs. Price voted a provisional ballot in Rockingham County.

The Rockingham BOE was unable to locate any record of Mrs. Price's registration update, either the mailed application or the DMV submission. When Mrs. Price's provisional ballot came before the BOE for adjudication, the BOE disapproved her provisional ballot.

Mrs. Price was otherwise qualified to vote in Rockingham County as of the March 3, 2026 primary: she is a U.S. citizen over 18, not disqualified by felony, and she had established her domicile in Madison well more than 30 days before the election. North Carolina law broadly construes residence to provide qualified citizens the opportunity to register and vote, and a voter's residence is the place where her habitation is fixed and to which she intends to return.

Accordingly, the only reason Mrs. Price was unable to cast a regular ballot in her correct precinct was not any failure of eligibility on her part, or a failure of diligence, but an apparent administrative error by government officials in the processing of her registration update—either through the DMV transaction, the county or state board's receipt/processing of the mailed application, or both—despite her diligent, redundant efforts to update her registration.

Thus, due to no fault of her own and despite her diligent efforts, Mrs. Price was unable to participate in the primary election for Senate District 26.

Legal Argument

Mrs. Price's provisional ballot should be approved and counted because she was a qualified voter domiciled in Rockingham County and Senate District 26 at the time of the March 3, 2026 primary, and the only reason she was not issued a regular ballot was an administrative failure to process her timely registration update.

The North Carolina Constitution guarantees the right to vote to qualified citizens. N.C. Const. art. VI, § 1. The Constitution also provides that a person who has resided in the precinct or election district for 30 days preceding the

election is entitled to vote. N.C. Const. art. VI, § 2(1). The Election Code likewise requires 30 days’ residence and provides that qualified electors are eligible to vote. NCGS § 163-55(a). Residence is determined by domicile and “shall be broadly construed to provide all persons with the opportunity to register and to vote.” NCGS § 163-57(1).

North Carolina law also places an affirmative duty on county boards to register qualified voters who apply, and to accept voter registration applications submitted through authorized methods and agencies, including the DMV. NCGS §§ 163-82.1(b); -82.3(c).

Mrs. Price took the steps the statutes contemplate to update her registration after moving counties, including submitting a voter registration application by mail. NCGS § 163-82.6(a). She also attempted to update her registration through a DMV transaction, as provided for in NCGS § 163-82.19(a). Critically, the General Assembly has directed that DMV voter-registration applications accepted by the deadline “shall be treated as timely made” and that “no person who completes an application at that drivers license office shall be denied the vote in that election for failure to apply earlier than that deadline.” NCGS § 163-82.19(a).

Mrs. Price is an otherwise qualified voter who was required to vote provisionally solely because her timely registration update was not processed through no fault of her own. The Rockingham BOE should not refuse her the franchise due to an administrative error. Instead, the BOE should approve and count her provisional ballot.

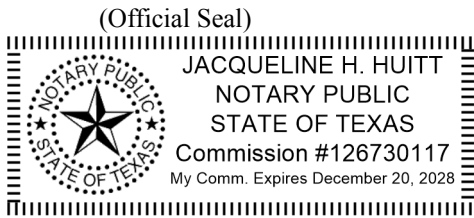

Declaration of James Brian Price

I, James Brian Price, declare under penalty of perjury as follows:

1. The statements in this declaration are based upon my personal knowledge and experience.
2. I am a U.S. citizen, over the age of 21, and a voter residing in Rockingham County. The address of my residence is 540 Bald Head Loop, Madison, NC, where I reside with my wife, Kara Millsaps Price.
3. I am not a felon or otherwise disqualified by law from voting.
4. My residence is within the Hogans-1 precinct in Rockingham County.
5. My residence, and the Hogans-1 precinct, are both located in Senate District 26 for purposes of the March 3, 2026 primary election.
6. I moved to my Madison address in late 2024. Before that, I lived and was registered to vote in Guilford County.
7. In late 2024, after my wife and I moved to our current Rockingham County address, I completed a North Carolina Voter Registration Application reflecting my change of address. My wife also completed her own voter registration application. We mailed our voter registration applications together, in the same envelope.
8. While my wife updated her driver's license to our Rockingham County address via an in-person visit to the NCDMV in August 2025, I updated my driver's license address online via the DMV website. I do not recall whether, as part of that process, I also attempted to update my voter registration address online.
9. I voted in person in the March 3, 2026 primary election at the Hogans-1 precinct's polling place: Comer's Chapel, 1981 Bald Head Loop, Madison. My wife was with me at the time.
10. I appeared on the voter registration rolls and voted in the March 3, 2026 primary election without incident.
11. When my wife attempted to vote, she was informed that she was not registered in Rockingham County and could not vote there. She was informed that she was still registered in Guilford County. This was despite the fact that she timely mailed an updated voter registration form at the same time as me, and instructed the DMV to change her voter registration address during her in person visit.

12. Officials at the Hogans-1 polling place offered my wife a provisional ballot, which I witnessed her complete and return.
13. My wife took the same steps as me to update her voter registration address to Rockingham County (or if anything made even more efforts to do so), and her efforts were timely. There is no apparent reason besides government error why her voter registration should not have been accepted and processed when mine was.

At the DMV, I was asked whether I would like to update my voter registration in addition to my driver's license. I instructed the DMV staff to go ahead and update my voter registration as well. I believed this to be a redundant effort to make doubly sure my updated voter registration was processed.
9. I attempted to vote in person in the March 3, 2026 primary election at the Hogans-1 precinct's polling place: Comer's Chapel, 1981 Bald Head Loop, Madison. My husband James was with me at the time.
10. My husband James appeared on the voter registration rolls and voted in the March 3, 2026 primary election without incident.
11. When I attempted to vote, I was informed that I was not registered in Rockingham County and could not vote there. I was informed that I was still registered in Guilford County. This was despite timely completing two attempts to update my voter registration address, and my husband's voter registration being updated without incident.

12. I presented my driver's license with my Rockingham County address to Hogans-1 precinct officials.
13. Officials at the Hogans-1 polling place offered me a provisional ballot, which I completed and returned.
14. On my provisional ballot, I cast a vote in the Senate District 26 Republican primary for Philip Berger.
15. Shortly after casting a provisional ballot, I called the North Carolina State Board of Elections in an effort to prove my eligibility and ensure my ballot was counted. I was promised a return phone call, but never received one.
16. My understanding is that my provisional ballot was adjudicated ineligible by the Rockingham County Board of Elections because county officials could not locate a record of my updated voter registration.
17. There is no apparent reason (besides government error) why my husband's voter registration update should have been accepted and processed, and mine not. We both mailed voter registration applications reflecting our Rockingham County address in late 2024. Plus I took the additional step of asking the DMV to update my voter registration in August 2025.
18. As the foregoing suggests, the fact that I did not appear on the Rockingham County voter registration rolls on Election Day was not the result of any lack of diligence on my part in updating my voter registration. Instead, it appears to be the result of government officials losing my voter registration applications or failing to act on them.

I declare under penalty of perjury that the foregoing is true and correct.
