


The "Library of Things" makes a day at Memorial Park a Breeze.

A Letter from the Executive Director

Dear Residents,

As we gear up for the fall, I'm proud to report that we've had a recordbreaking summer here at the Community Park District. Our summer camp program ran at capacity providing a season full of fun activities, field trips, and friendship for more than 100 local children each week. On top of that, we had 160 kids participate in our unique Afternoon Antics program at Stone Monroe and Robinhood Parks. As of the writing of this letter, the Community Park District has generated more than \$256,000 in summer program revenue. To put things in perspective, prior to 2019, the district's summer revenue record was \$103,421.

Summer Camp provided a safe summer full of fun and friendship for 100 children each week.

160 kids participated in **Afternoon Antics**

Summer programming and operations created 40 seasonal jobs in La Grange Park.

Our summer programs and operational activities also provided seasonal employment for 40 individuals. From camp counselors to park maintenance, these jobs provide invaluable experience and the opportunity to do work that positively impacts the community.

Summer of 2023 kicked off our new partnership with the La Grange Park Little League. This season, the League replaced the fence guards at Hanesworth Park and invested nearly \$45,000 in the renovation of the Hanesworth Park Pressbox. In addition to providing ball field mix and reimbursing the park district for direct costs such as electric and water, the league has also contributed close to \$10,000 to offset the cost of maintaining the fields for play. This partnership has vastly improved the field conditions and safety at each and every one of our parks, making La Grange Park an enviable destination location

LGPLL invested \$62,000+ in park improvements

Additionally, thanks to the ComEd Energy Efficiency Program, the park district was able to replace 33 stadium floodlights at Hanesworth Park with new energy efficient LED flood lamps. The program also replaced 159 fixtures in the Recreation Center with new LED fixtures. The total cost of this project was \$113,096. ComEd awarded the park district \$87,888.25 in incentives and bonuses, and the Community Park District invested \$25,207.75 out of pocket. ComEd estimates that the park district will save nearly \$3,400 per year in energy costs alone. A portion of that annual savings will be passed on to Little League. However, even more exciting is the environmental impact of this small project, which ComEd estimates will remove 21 metric tons of CO, from our shared environment on an annual basis. That's the equivalent of taking four cars off the road every year. This fall, we are looking forward to the complete renovation of Beach Oak Park, and the addition of





REGISTRATION INFORMATION:

- 1. **Resident Registration:** Online and walk-in resident registration will begin on Thursday, August 3, at 8:30 am. To register online, go to www.communityparkdistrict.org. For walk-in registration, visit the Park District office at 1501 Barnsdale Road, during business hours. Residents may only register their own family members.
- 2. **Non-resident Registration:** Online and walk-in registration for non-residents begins Thursday, August 10, at 8:30 am. To register online, go to www.communityparkdistrict.org. For walk-in registration, visit the Park District office during normal business hours.
- 3. First Come, First Served: All programs have a minimum and maximum enrollment and will be filled on a first come, first served basis.
- 4. Program Waiting Lists: Maximum enrollments for programs ensure quality and safety for all participants. Waiting lists will be established. Program rosters are monitored for withdrawals and waiting lists are contacted as spots become available. Residents on a waiting list are given priority when an enrollment becomes available.
- 5. **Cancellations:** All classes are subject to cancellation if they do not meet the minimum enrollments a week before the class starts, unless otherwise noted. A full refund will be given.
- 6. **Refund Policy:** A full refund will be issued if requested within five business days prior to the start of the class. A 20% administrative fee will be applied if request is received within four or fewer business days prior to the start of the class. PETS IN THE PARKS POLICY

Animals - No person shall bring any animal in or upon any CPD property without first obtaining a permit from the CPD, unless enrolled in a park district sponsored dog training program. Service animals are excluded from this policy.

- 1. Dogs are strictly prohibited from all CPD events, except for special events where animals are part of the event with prior CPD approval; from all athletic fields, all tennis courts, all basketball courts; all playgrounds; and parks, except those designated as "Dog Friendly".
- 2. CPD "Dog Friendly Parks" are defined as:
 - A. Memorial Park
 - B. Hanesworth Park
 - C. Robinhood Park
 - D. Stone Monroe Park
- 3. No person owning or keeping a dog shall allow such dog to run freely in any park, including "Dog Friendly Parks."
- 4. Dogs must be securely fastened and restrained by a leash not more than six feet in length at all times.
- 5. Dog licenses and proof of vaccinations must be displayed on the dog's collar.
- 6. No person owning or keeping a dog shall allow such dog to enter upon or remain upon any area of the park utilized as an athletic field, court, children's play area, or posted to prohibit dogs.
- 7. Owners or keepers of dogs shall carry appropriate equipment to and shall immediately clean the dog's waste and deposit the waste in an appropriate waste receptacle.
- 8. Aggressive or nuisance animals are prohibited from all parks.
- 9. Dogs that exhibit aggressive behavior or nuisance barking, must be removed from the park immediately.
- 10. Any person found in violation of this section shall be fined not less than \$50 or more than \$250 Please notify us if you see violations of this policy by emailing jcannaday@communityparkdistrict.org.


FACILITY RENTAL
