Just as river levels and river banks fluctuate, we saw a number of changes, many of which can be seen in the reports found in this Annual Report. But here are a few more that need mentioned:


- We celebrated **6 baptisms**, the most in a calendar year yet!

Financial Report

Bottom Line: You had a net loss of \$19,269.88 for the year.

- That amount included Non-Budgeted Building Fund Expenditures which totaled \$12,895.92.
- However, there is \$5,692.82 in the Building Fund.
- Budgeted expenses were \$15,330.90 more than general income.
- However, you kept expenses to \$13,118.49 under budget.

General \$26,704.78 \$41,500.00 Building \$5,692.82 TOTAL: \$73,897.60

All in all, I'd say it wasn't a great year financially, but it wasn't horrible either. Your income was down, but you did a good job mitigating your expenses. You paid your staff, improved your building, and gave away over \$15,000.
