DISCUSSION

Read Mark 4:1-20 (Suggestion: split the reading: v. 1-9, then v. 10-20.)

- 1. Let's spend time identifying the various parts of the parable:
 - a. What is the seed?
 - b. What makes someone "hard soil"?
 - c. What makes a person "rocky soil"?
 - d. What makes someone else "thorny soil"?
 - e. What indicates someone is "good soil"?
 - f. Who is the sower?



- 2. a. What needs to happen with the first three soil types in order to become good soil?
 - b. In light of your answer to Part A above, would you say someone who is categorized as one type of soil is destined to remain in that category? Why or why not?

MAKING IT PERSONAL

- 3. Which soil types have you been in your life?
- 4. Which soil type would you identify with currently?
- 5. What is one thing you feel the Holy Spirit calling you to do to become more like the good soil rather than the other three?
- 6. If you follow Jesus, how can you be a sower? If you don't follow Jesus, why not?
