DGRI actively engages many individuals and stakeholders from metro Grand Rapids in the decision-making flow of the organization's fiduciary boards, and project steering committees. This robust leadership network ensures DGRI continually brings together people with different knowledge, perspective and experience to solve problems, identify opportunities and directly support the day-to-day work of improving Grand Rapids' Downtown neighborhoods.

About World of Winter 2027 (January 8 - February 28, 2027)

The World of Winter Festival is a two-month celebration designed to transform Grand Rapids into a vibrant, four season city by activating public spaces with art, activities and events—all completely free to the public.

In 2026, the festival hosted 100+ events and installations over seven weeks, attracting nearly 4 million visits downtown, making it the largest and longest-running winter festival in North America.

Activate Grant recipients are automatically part of the World of Winter Festival. They will be featured on the website and promoted as part of the festival.

Activate Grants

Funding Projects up to \$10,000 each

Applications Due: July 26, 2026 at 11:59 p.m. EST

DGRI offers grant support for activating public spaces to culturally enhance our community. The purpose of this grant is to provide artists, event organizers and placemakers the opportunity to help create a unique experience for visits downtown and share their creativity with the community by helping us activate the public realm.

DGRI is seeking proposals for activations (artworks, events, sculptures, etc.) that will be hosted in Downtown Grand Rapids between January 8 and February 28, 2027 for our annual World of Winter festival.

Any space Downtown can be a source of inspiration and a place for activation with permission from the property owner(s). It is the responsibility of the grant applicant to find a feasible location for their proposal. DGRI staff is available to support location identification. Proposals that incorporate interactive elements and engagement are encouraged. All proposals must be able to withstand wintry weather including cold, rain, sleet, hail, snow, wind and ice.

Proposed activations must be suitable for all audiences, accessible for all abilities and open to the public free of cost. Any proposed activations on publicly-owned property requires approval by the City of Grand Rapids Arts Advisory Council.

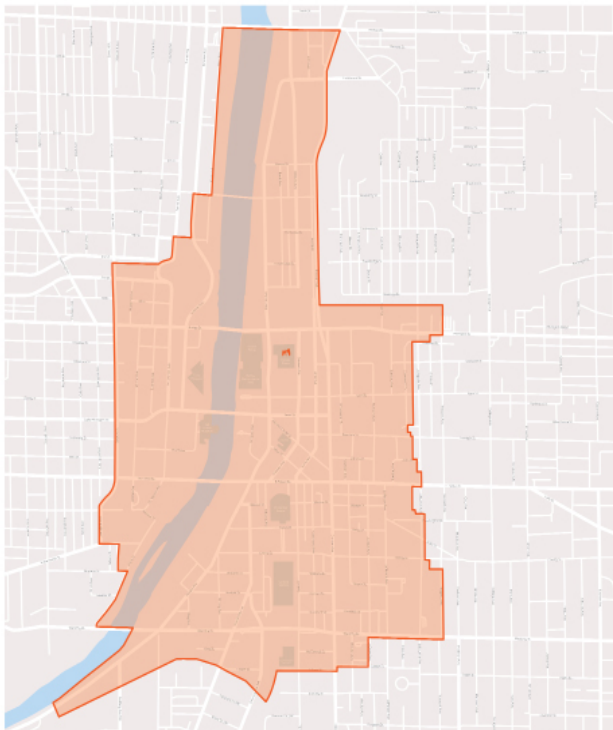
Types of Site Activation

This application is open to any medium or form of activation. This could include, but is not limited to, site specific installation, sculpture, alley activations, events, performance, projection, murals and multimedia.

Location

The applicant may propose a specific location within DGRI's boundary or multiple locations that might be suitable for the proposed work. There are some suggested locations at the end of this document to help inspire and provide some ideas.

It is the responsibility of the applicant to gain approval from the owner of the location. If the location is on public property, DGRI will assist the applicant with the process, but it is ultimately the applicant's responsibility.

Insurance

Artists are encouraged to explore purchasing insurance for artworks, but it is not required. If your project involves an event you may also be required to carry specific insurance.

Eligibility

- Applicants must be at least 18 years old
- Applicants must be in good standing with Downtown Grand Rapids Inc
- All activations must be free and open to the public

Budget

Artists may request funding for up to \$10,000.

The funding may be used for anything relating to the project such as materials, travel, engineering, machinery, insurance, artist stipend etc. Selected applicants will be paid 50% upon gaining necessary approvals/permits and 50% upon completion of the project.

When budgeting, applicants should consider including safety materials as well, such as cord covers and anything else needed to maintain a safe environment around the work.

Contracts

DGRI will send a standard Activate Grant contract to grantees for review. Upon signing, the grantee may invoice for the first payment.

Selection Process

A selection committee comprised of community members and stakeholders will review each application and provide recommendations for funding.

Applications will be evaluated based on the submitted application materials, how well a proposed project activates its space, community engagement and merit. Following selection committee recommendation, DGRI will contact selected applicants. Funding is limited and highly competitive. Proposals for grant funding that are political, sexual or religious in any way will not be considered.

June 2026 : Applications open

July 21, 2026 : Deadline for applicant questions submitted to kmoore@downtowngr.org by 11:59PM EST

July 26, 2026 : Applications deadline by 11:59PM EST

Mid-September, 2026 : Applicants notified

September - October 2026 : Installation plans & schedule finalized, permits obtained from the City of Grand Rapids as needed.

November 5, 2026 at 1:00 PM EST : Arts Advisory Committee Meeting (as needed).

January 8 - February 28, 2027: World of Winter 2027

March 2027: Installations completed and removed

DGRI may revise the schedule at any time in the process. Changes will be communicated to applicants.

Considerations

- Projects that are interactive will be given greater consideration. Please consider how the public will be able to interactive with the proposed artwork.
- If your proposal is part of another event, please consider elaborating how this grant will benefit the community outside the dates of the event.
- Every project on city owned property must be approved by the City of Grand Rapid's Arts Advisory Committee. DGRI will work with you to prepare materials for this.
- All proposed projects should be accessible.
- All proposed projects should not require security.
- Projects should promote and amplify a diverse and inclusive representation of the many cultural and ethnic backgrounds of our City.
- In exchange for, and as consideration for, any discretionary grant money awarded to an applicant, DGRI may use and display images of the Installation/Event for DGRI-related purposes, including advertising, educational and promotional materials and multimedia publicity in support of promotion of DGRI projects and initiatives.
- DGRI is a 501c(3) organization and does not sell or profit from any imagery, photography or videography of any proposed activation.



How to Submit a Proposal

Please submit the following information by **July 26, 2026**. File names should include artists' first and last name.

- [Please complete this short questionnaire.](#) (Does not need to be emailed or added to Dropbox)
- Resume or CV that includes relative experience.
- Artist website or social media that represents similar projects. If you don't have either please provide at least (5) images or videos of relatable previous projects.
- Proposed location(s) for project. You can find a list of locations at the end of this document or propose a new location.
- Detailed physical and conceptual description of proposed artwork. This should also include a description of materials being used, any programming involved, maintenance plan and any other information you feel would be helpful for the review committee. If your installation has interactive components please explain.
- Renderings and/or images of proposed project. **Please do not submit AI renderings.**
- Site-map of proposed installation/project.
- Estimated budget including a breakdown of costs. Keep in mind DGRI pays 1/2 up front and 1/2 after the project is complete.
- Although using AI as a tool is permitted, it is preferable that most of the application is composed by the applicant.
