Participatory Process

- City and DGRI staff establish working group
- Research promising practices
- Community engagement includes:
 - Focus group with food trucks owners
 - Survey of ~30 food trucks
 - Interviews with 40+ restauranteurs/business owners
 - Dialogues w/ community stakeholders
 - Dialogues w/ DGRI citizen Alliances & Board action

Proposed Solution

- Adopt a pilot "food truck" ordinance that:
 - -Streamlines business licensing
 - Prioritizes public safety
 - Permits food trucks on public property
 - -Respects the proximity of restaurants
 - Clearly defines vendor responsibilities
 - Establishes 2-year evaluation period
