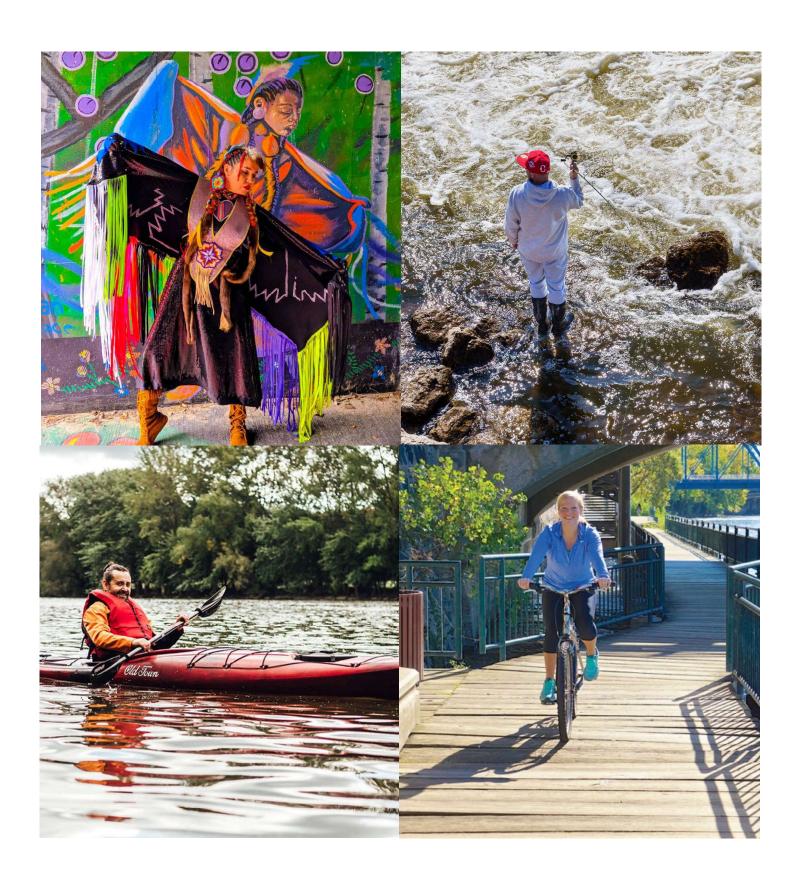

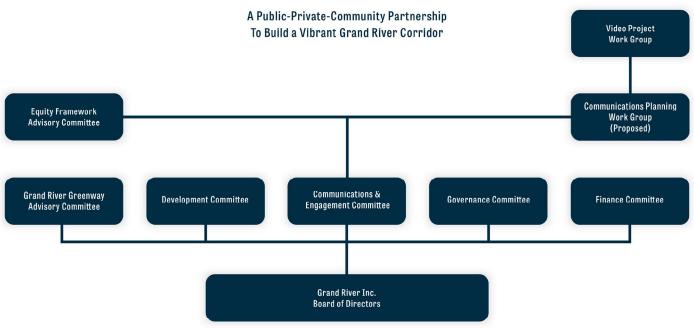
Balance
