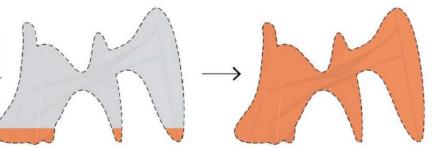






PUBLIC ENGAGEMENT SUMMARY \ EVENT #1

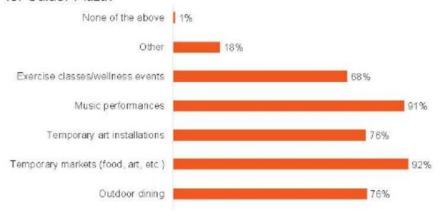




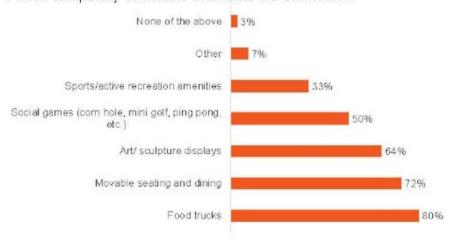
Which of these elements makes you most uncomfortable at Calder Plaza and needs to be addressed?

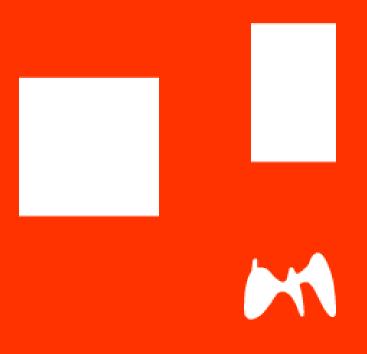


What types of events/activities do you feel are appropriate for Calder Plaza?



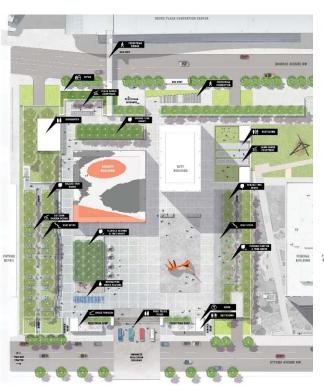

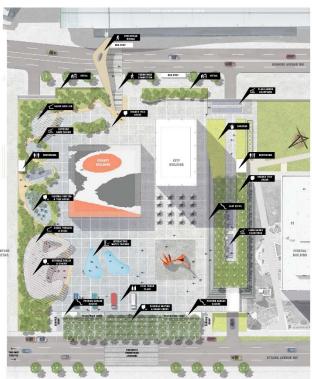

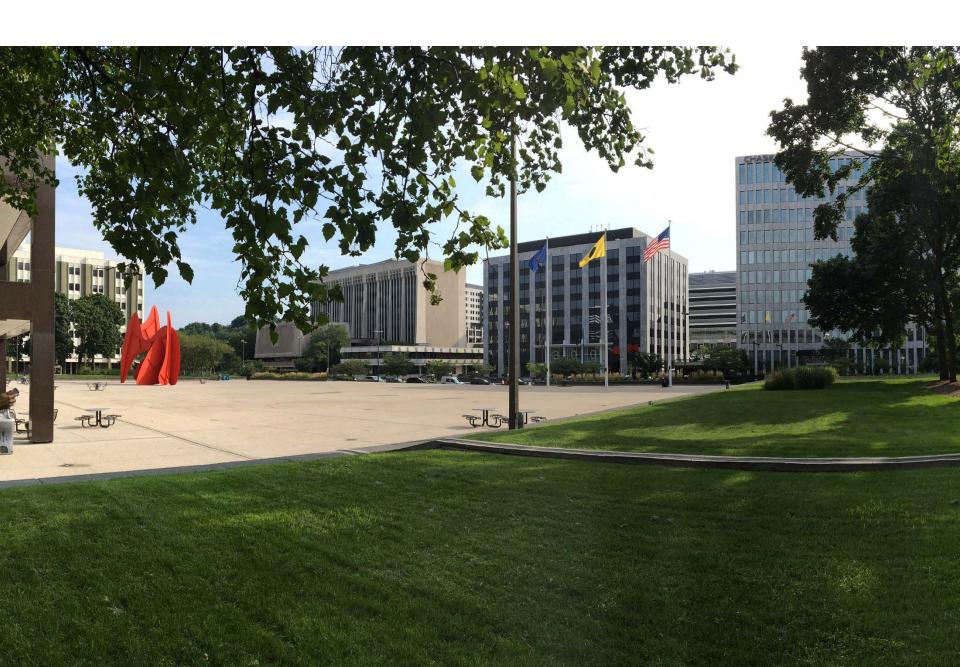

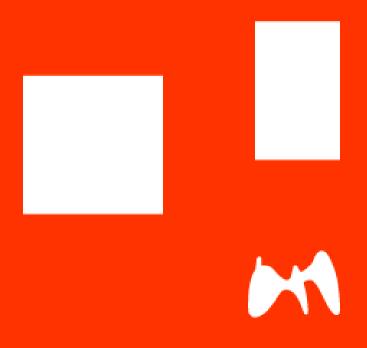

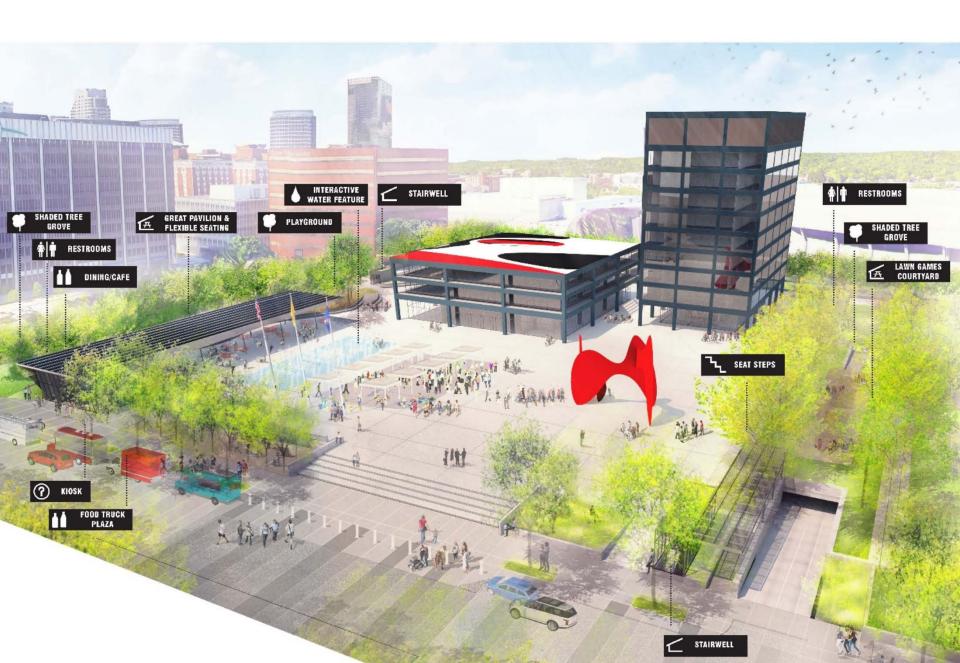

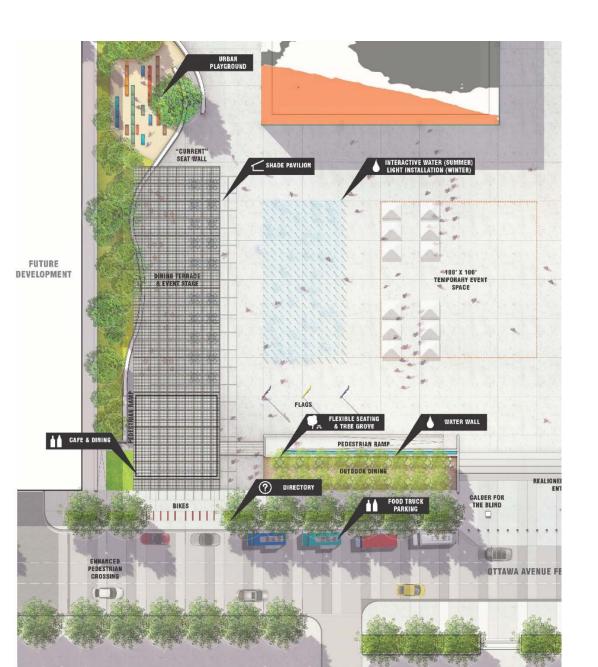

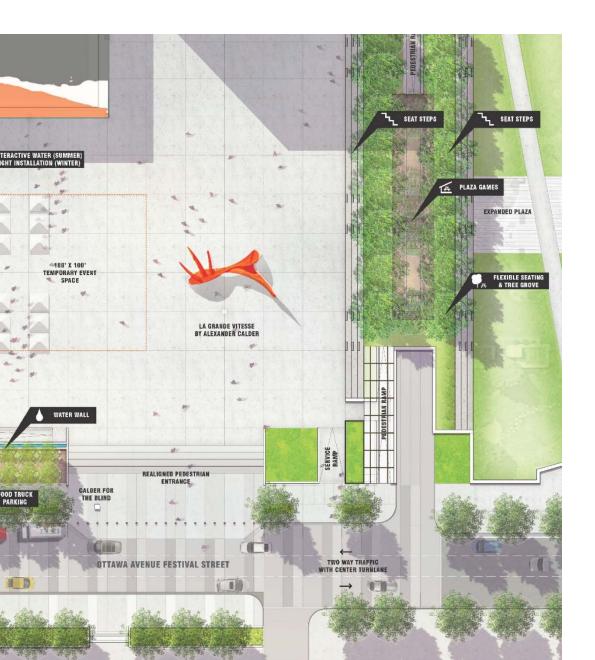
