Ritamarie@All: *Saccharomyces cerevisiae*: Antibodies against *S. cerevisiae* are found in 60–70% of patients with Crohn's disease and 10–15% of patients with ulcerative colitis (and 8% of healthy controls).

Michele@All: This info is so awesome! My brother died of colon cancer which started as Ulcerative Colitis. This could so have possibly saved his life and helped him regain his health.
