

Methods and findings

We estimate both macro level models and individual level fixed effect models.

We find that an one percentage point increase in ADHD medication rate caused a 33 percentage decrease in foster care risk for children aged 6-18





Figure 1. Foster Care Caseloads

Figure 2: The US Unemployment Rate since 2000








Figure 2: Cumulative Risk of Foster Care Placement by Age 18

For All Children






Cumulative Risk of Foster Care Placement by Age 18

ADHD medication rates for children and youth in Denmark and U.S., 1995-2011



Children - 1998, 2004, 2010








Socioeconomic background pre-treatment Treatment

Outcomes post-treatment




