#### From Pastor Peg...

What a strange year this has been. We had winter in April and summer weather in May. June was wet, and who knows what July will bring. Ecclesiastes tells us that there is a time for every purpose under Heaven, and we like those times to be predictable. We want to know what's coming, so we can prepare. Spring should be spring, not summer or fall, and life events should take place at their normal ages and stages. But it isn't always necessarily so.

What happens when the world doesn't fulfill our expectations?

I believe the solution is three-fold: work hard, play harder and pray hardest. We need to work as hard as we can to provide for our families and our future, whatever it may bring. We need to play even harder. God created us to enjoy life's blessings, not to worry about tomorrow's problems. And we need to pray most of all. Prayer connects us with God. Prayer keeps our eyes upon eternity rather than the present, and prayer recognizes our priorities and our expectations.

The third chapter of Ecclesiastes begins with its list of life events which each happens in its own Season. But the passage goes on:

"God... has set eternity in the hearts of men; yet they cannot fathom what God has done from beginning to end. I know that there is nothing better for men than to be happy and do good while they live. That everyone may eat and drink, and find satisfaction in all his toil - this is the gift of God. I know that everything God does will endure forever; nothing can be added to it and nothing can be taken from it. God does it so that men will revere him."



#### Community Garden News Update

The OUMC Community Garden committee received a \$300.00 grant from the North End Community Improvement Collaborative (*necic*) with the stipulation that our church would match that amount. This is the second time we have received monetary assistance. We are greatly appreciative of this financial help.

This year our goal was to expand two beds, build a new one, build a picnic table with shade, build a sturdier vertical garden (which the kids are helping out with), and reinforce the short steel fence posts with longer ones. The ideas was to beautify the garden to make it more pleasing for our church family and our neighbors. We hope we have accomplished this. So far things are growing well, and we have cut the greens several times for our neighbors in the apartments next door. Let us know if you would like to have something when it is ready.

Many thanks to Larry Bixler who built the table, the vertical garden, put in the fence posts, cut the lumber and helped Mary Ann Stotts and Janet Bixler assemble the beds. Larry also painted the vertical garden. Janet suggested the rainbow effect. Can you tell? Mary Ann carted extra dirt and mushroom compost to fill the extra beds. Dolce's Tree Service donated bark mulch which is under the table. The compost bins are planted with honeydews, cantaloupe, and watermelon. (We ran out of space to plant viney things.) Janet started the tomato and pepper plants from seed, plus the *necic* gave us some plants.

On Friday mornings, we are meeting at 10:00 to weed, water, harvest or learn about new procedures (like our potato bucket plantings), and possibly make something sometime. Madeline Sauer has been a dedicated helper on Fridays. We could use more volunteers, so come join us if you can.

Throughout the week, Mary Ann and Janet water and mow. We are appreciative of God sending us rainfall at the right time.

Come and visit the garden. It changes from one week to another. Enjoy the surroundings. If you like, leave comments in our notebook found in the old realtor's box inside the garden.
