

This group works also to spread awareness of our Salida UM Church Family by creating different ways we might connect with those who are not yet a part of the church but might benefit from belonging to this community of Christ's care and love (whether that be through spreading signage in fruitful locations, setting up booths at local community events, gathering together for fellowship in heavily frequented spaces outside our church walls, etc).

*TRUSTEES This group works together to maintain the buildings and properties of the church by being attentive to the ever-changing needs of our historic sanctuary, assuring our sidewalks and ramps are safe and accessible (+checking light bulbs, eye-balling roof shingles, standing on ladders, etc).

*SHOWER MINISTRY We are looking for at least three more volunteers for this vital act of care toward the most vulnerable in our Salida community. Our congregation lives well into God's call to serve the homeless and thankfully has the resources to help folks clean up so they can regain their sense of self as well as reintegrate with the community with greater potential for future work opportunities while receiving the respect they deserve as God's children and as human beings.

*Other Opportunities Include volunteering to help with: Women's Winter Shelter for the Homeless, front office administrative needs, hosting fellowship, ushering, serving communion, joining chimes/choir, fundraising, etc.



Raft Guide Dinners 2025 Season 13 Overview

On August 31st we dedicated the Sunday Morning Worship Service to celebrating this summer's Raft Guide Dinner Season and acknowledging the volunteers who make it happen! Below is some of the information that was shared regarding this season.

One of the highlights of that morning was watching a video message from Luke Pinneo. Luke was the raft guide who came to our church and soon after proposed that we consider offering a meal and access to our showers to the raft guide community. We started the dinners in June 2012. And the rest is ongoing history!

During this summer's 6 weeks of dinners, we had **241 DIFFERENT GUIDES** attend with the support of **56 DIFFERENT VOLUNTEERS** from the church and the community. **We served 700 meals to the guides and volunteers.**

The guides came to us from 21 DIFFERENT RAFTING COMPANIES, representing 44 DIFFERENT STATES and 4 countries: CHILE, AUSTRALIA, ZIMBABWAI AND THE UNITED STATES.

THANK YOU TO ALL THE VOLUNTEERS WHO HELPED IN SO MANY WAYS... DURING THE DAYS PRIOR TO THE DINNER AND ON THE DAY OF THE DINNER. We had volunteers who planned, shopped, chopped, cooked, cleaned, organized, restocked supplies, washed dishes, took pictures, played music and reminded me to eat lunch.

Special thank you to those who donated financially to support the Raft Guide Dinners....none of this is possible without your financial support. Thank you to those who offered the matching grants and to those who

donated to meet those grants. Thank you to the Arkansas River Outfitters Association for their financial support this year and a very special thank you to Luke Pinneo (the guide who started this labor of love) and his parents for their ongoing financial support through the National Christian Foundation – Pacific Northwest.

Thank you to those who sponsored the hygiene table. This resource is a highlight for the guides.

Thank you to those who set-up and took down tents, tables and chairs for each dinner (including gratitude for the guides themselves who helped with take down each night); to those who served the food, cleaned up and a HUGE thank you to Jeri Swann who washed dishes during the day and Jim Oberheide who washed dishes during the dinners!!!

Special thanks to our community service partners & meal partners: Chaffee Community Clinic, Chaffee County Acuwellness, Moonlight Pizza and Pizza Rio, The Swindlers Golf Group who sponsored Grill Night, Las Camelinas, Andre' Harris, Beck Cerone with Sober Bar Salida, and the Blue Ice Cream Truck. Special thank you to Bill Volz for providing fun activities for Tropical Night!

Each week we offered a themed meal with food for varied dietary needs including meat eaters, vegetarians, vegan and gluten free guests; available showers; a free hygiene table; thought provoking and spiritually evoking books for the taking.... all in a non-judgmental community environment.

Each week we ask the guides to give us written feedback to let us know what worked and what didn't work and how these dinners are meaningful to them. Their comments are so inspiring and steeped in gratitude. When I recently shared some of the quotes with Luke, who lives in Washington state, he replied, "Amazing ~ those comments could bring tears to a glass eye. Bravo team!"

I say thank you to everyone for an amazing season and we'll be planning for next year before you know it! So please plan to join us in a way that you feel called to do so.



This protocol is used as a crisis intervention treatment following disasters world-wide to help prevent PTSD and to support resilience. The standardized 5NP (needle protocol) using the NADA (National Acupuncture Detoxification Association) ear points involves the placement of 5 sterile needles in each ear, which are retained for approximately 20-40 minutes. <u>Possible benefits include</u> General feeling of well-being, improved sleep, sense of relaxation, decreased cravings for addictive substances.

Youth age 12y/o and older with the ability to sit still for 30min are welcome to participate. Youth under the age of 16 require a parent or guardian to sign the consent form. Anyone with children who are not able to sit still for 30 min can see if a practitioner would like to work with them individually.
