

I like riding bicycles. Always have. On road, off road. Multiple gears, single speed. I like riding bikes.

As a kid, I was especially attracted to the speed. As an adult, I'm especially attracted to the distance. But most of all, both as a kid and as an adult, what I like most is the freedom to see new things and eventually arrive at some place new.

There are two fundamental realities I know about riding bikes:

If you stop peddling, you stop making progress. It's not complicated. To move, you must peddle. To make progress, you must put in effort.

If both feet don't peddle forward, you don't move. One-foot peddling forward and one peddling backward won't work. You won't move.

Congregations aren't a whole lot different. People must peddle (put in work, help, engage) for the congregation to progress. And the peddling must be forward – toward something new – and not backward – toward something that may or may not have existed in the good ole days.

My hope and prayer for FCC New Castle is that you progress. This community and God's world need you.

Kiva Loans to Honor All Women and Men

Every May and June since 2012, the congregation of FCC has participated in Kiva loans to improve the lives of women and men around the world. We do this to honor the important men and women who have parented us, helped us, taught us and loved us. We honor mothers, fathers, Sunday School teachers, mentors, and volunteers in our church and community.

More than 1.7 billion people around the world are unbanked and can't access the financial services they need. Kiva is an international nonprofit, founded in 2005 in San Francisco, California that allows people to lend money via the Internet to low-income entrepreneurs and students in 77 countries.

Kiva's mission is "to expand financial access to help underserved communities thrive." Kiva does this by crowdfunding loans and unlocking capital for the underserved, improving the quality and cost of financial services, and addressing the underlying barriers to financial access around the world. Through Kiva's work, students can pay for tuition, women can start businesses, farmers are able to invest in equipment and families can afford needed emergency care.

Kiva believes, "lending alongside thousands of others is one of the most powerful and sustainable ways to create economic and social good. Lending on Kiva creates a partnership of mutual dignity and makes it easy to touch more lives with the same dollar. Fund a loan, get repaid, fund another. "

Since 2012, First Christian has loaned \$2,775 to men and women all over the world. We have been repaid \$2,184 so far and have only lost \$58.88 through loan default.

FCC loans for 2021 include Charlyn from Ginatilan, Cebu; Ening from Indonesia; Jona from the Philippines; Brijan from Albania; Juan from Nicaragua and Alexandru who lives in Moldova. Their projects include items that we might take for granted such as: sanitary toilet facilities and water connections in their houses; a furnace to keep a family warm. Requests are also granted for plans to increase income such as planting a cherry tree orchard like Brijan from Albania who states, "I want to increase my income as I plan to create my own family and also take care of my parents,"

The funds to grant these loans are included in the FCC expense budget each year. Thank you, FCC congregation, for supporting global outreach and improving the lives of people all over the world.

Creation-wide praise chorus

"All creatures of our God and King, lift up your voice and with us sing!" These words — just one paraphrase of a text by St. Francis of Assisi — seem a fitting description of springtime, when leaves and flowers pop out afresh, birdsong is heard again and hibernating animals emerge from dens and burrows, many with new babies in tow.

Psalm 148 may have served as inspiration for Francis, calling not only "young men and women alike, old and young together" (v. 12, NRSV), but also animals and birds, wind and water, mountains and trees, to praise the Lord. James L. Mays writes: "We human beings ... should recognize that we are in the list with all the creation and creatures as creature and creation ourselves. We are in our obligation to praise no different from and no more than all the rest."

When you head outside on a bright spring day, notice what praise looks like in non-human form and how it sounds from nonhuman voices. How can we best join "all creatures of our God and King" in worship?


Graduate Spotlight, Mallory Cross
