The Season of Lent is a good time to fix relationships. One way to build strong relationships quickly is to admit your mistakes. That might sound easy at first, but few people practice it. James 5:16 tells us to confess or admit your mistakes to one another... and THAT can be terrifying and risky!

Therefore confess your sins to each other and pray for each other so that you may be healed. James 5:16

This wonderful little verse though is powerfully effective, and when done in a Christ-like manner can bring about three important growth areas in a Christian's life. When you confess your sin to someone you have sinned against you get....

A fresh start. Ask forgiveness, receive forgiveness, and then let it go!

Emotional and spiritual healing. Emotional healing really comes from telling someone else. It sure helps to "get it off your chest."

The power to change. This power comes from God through His grace. When we get our vertical relationship right, relationship with others improve drastically.

God wants to turn your hurt into healing. Then he wants to use you in the lives of other people. He's just waiting for you to surrender. Sounds risky to be that open and transparent, but I promise you, it's worth the risk! One note of action on this. Make sure you admit your faults to someone you trust! Doing otherwise will only complicate your life and relationships.

Below is a picture of our visit to Mary Lou Dye (center).


