

From the Pastor's Study

The Power of Resurrection

I drove home on a Friday afternoon in February, and I spotted a green plant sprouted under the tree in the parsonage yard. It was a winter day and snow still covered the land after the second snow storm hit our area. I stopped to look at it closely. It was a daffodil that had started growing and it was a good contrast between the green plant and white snow around it. I felt a sense of mystery in life there. Life was hibernates during the cold winter in the frozen soil. When the time comes and the sun melts the snow and frozen soil, life comes out of it. I meditated on the mystery of the life of the resurrection.

Jesus became the first fruit of the resurrection when God raised him from death in three days. Jesus conquered the power of death. He said, "I am the Living One. I was dead, and behold, I am alive for ever and ever." (Revelation 1:18,NIV)). The message of Jesus' resurrection is the good news for all believers and it gives hope. Though we are living still under the power of death in and around us, like living in the cold winter covered with snow and in the frozen soil, our hope, the hope of new life in us never dies. The God who raised Jesus will raise us also. Therefore we declare the victory of God over the power of death here and now.

"Where, O death, is your victory? Where, O death, is your sting?.... Thanks be to God! He gives us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ." (1 Corinthians 15:55-56, NIV).

Living in the power of the resurrection is living in the hope of God's life in us, the life alive in us. Apostle Paul calls it
