

Faith Through The Eyes of a Child

Pastor Christina's Corner

When I was a little girl, one of my favorite children's stories was Paddington the Bear. I loved the stories and I had a really neat book about science and Paddington Bear. In general, if it has a dragon, a bear, or a princess I was all for it. This may still remain true today.

For many of you who attended Faye's Celebration of Life, I talked about her Comfort Bears. Today, June 23, Kathy came into my office and had a bag in her hands – I later came to find out she is secretly Mary Poppins; the bag held many treasures. Including one Comfort Bear. Kathy said to me that every once in a while, Faye would make a bear that she had not yet named, and she would say, "God knows who this bear is for." Kathy said this bear was for me, but it didn't have a name yet. I know a name will be given to me in time, though currently I am thinking of calling him Elijah – I already have a Jeremiah and an Isaiah at home. But we shall see.

But, it got me thinking of Paddington the Bear, and as July brings our Summer Sermon Series, *The Faith of our Children* – looking at Gospel messages through the eyes of children and their stories, I thought I would share some wisdom from Mr. Paddington the Bear and introduce you to my Comfort Bear.

For those who may not remember, Paddington the Bear moved into the family home of the Browns, and he caused quite a bit of trouble because his paws were always getting sticky marmalade all over the place. He had many adventures, but the Browns loved Paddington and they were all very happy together. They were family.

Family are those we are born into, but also those we are adopted into by conscious and unconscious actions. My big brother is an amazing brother by blood, and my best friend Tracy is a wonderful sister by choice. I belong to a Family in Christ and more specifically here at MIPC. Dale and I have been so very grateful for the love and support during this time of health concerns for me, and now the loss of my dad. You are our family and we love you dearly and hold you firmly in our prayers.

Jesus told us that all believers are our family and we must remember that families have responsibilities. We are to be vigilant about the welfare, both practical and spiritual, of all the other members. We cannot sit back and leave caring for our brothers and sisters in Christ to everyone else. That duty and joy belongs to you. We

do this by being actively involved in one another's lives, checking in with one another, loving one another, praying for one another, talking and growing our relationships. There are many ways that we care for the welfare of our family. Sometimes, it means broadening the circle of our family. When we welcome a new baby in our family, our love for one another does not diminish. Sure, sometimes routines change, and we readjust to the change in our family, but the love is there.

The story of Paddington Bear meeting the Browns reminds me that Jesus said very firm things about caring for strangers. Mr. & Mrs. Brown might have been a bit nervous about welcoming a stranger from Darkest Peru into their home, but they did it. Jesus told a story about a man who met a stranger on a road. He was not only a foreigner, he was from a nation which was at war with his own country, and there were years of suspicion and hatred between the two of countries. But when the Good Samaritan saw the man had been mugged and abandoned, he didn't care that he was a stranger. He saw the need and stepped in to help. He didn't think about his own financial cost, he didn't think about the time he was losing, he didn't even think about the dangers of getting involved with a stranger. These are the three things—money, time, and fear—that usually prevent us from helping a stranger.

Jesus invites us to make strangers our friends, to welcome in the newcomer, to take the risk of moving towards an unknown man or

woman.


How can we extend a hand of welcome to everyone we encounter in life?

Session Highlights

Your Session met June 22, 2023 with the following highlights:

- Approved Scouts' request to sell tickets in church portico after worship on Sundays in June and July for the spaghetti dinner approved for July 22 (5pm).
- Approved Preschool Committee request to add a weekly flat fee of \$5.00 to those parents who pay weekly tuition using credit cards. This will not affect those using automatic debit card and automatic credit card payments or those paying by check.
- Approved Preschool Committee request for a 90 day waiting period for signing bonus for newly hired preschool teachers.
- Approved Finance Committee request to increase Preschool Co-Director Robyn Mills' salary to match that of Co-Director Tammy Lewis, retroactive to the date of promotion to Co-Director (session meeting of February 16, 2023).
- Approved Finance Committee request for withdrawal of \$100,000 from the Anderson fund for the cost of the roof replacement. Initially funds will go to the church's operating fund but Finance will research the possibility of placing it into a high yield money market or 90 day CD fund, in order to earn interest until the anticipated date of use.

Our next Stated Session Meeting is scheduled for July 20, 2023.

Mission



On May 22, as MIPC's Family Promise congregation coordinator, I attended a gathering of other churches' designated coordinators. It was good to see a number of people I already knew like those from Grace Methodist and Riverside Presbyterian—the two congregations we assist when they are housing homeless families.

But the most important thing for you to know is that we are organizing a tour for MIPC folks to actually see the renovation to the new Family Promise facility (located right under the Cocoa Water Tower!). It is tentatively scheduled for Monday, July 17th at 4PM. To make the tour even more enticing we are going to go out to an early dinner afterwards somewhere nearby. Suggestions welcomed. Tara Pagliarini, the head of Family Promise of Brevard, is looking forward to being our guide. She will give you an opportunity to ask all your questions.

Here is a little background to whet your interest. The area that Family Promise is chiefly aiming at is zip code 32922, which has the lowest high school graduation rate and overall worst economic indicators in the state. The goal is to help lift these people out of the dead end jobs as well as the homelessness that is prevalent. To do that, in addition to housing homeless families in participating churches (which you already know about and some of you are helping with now), they have various offices housed in the newly renovated firehouse professionals to help students go further with their education, to help with health issues, financial issues—in short, to change their lives for the better.

Please join us—it will be time well spent. Contact me, Cheryl Mahan, or Frances Fernald to reserve a spot. Of course carpooling is always possible.



The Sharing Center's homeless clients experience many hardships as they deal with the elements throughout hurricane season. One way you can help is through donations of items like pop up tents, bug spray bottles, water resistant tarp, waterproof backpacks, flashlight with batteries, manual can openers, and waterproof sleeping bags. Any of these items can

be brought to MIPC and left in or near the white Sharing Center box in the Narthex.




