Pastor Christina's Corner

Deep abiding joy—the kind that helps us to rejoice even when weary—wouldn't that be the most amazing Christmas gift?

We are living in a weary world right now. Weary from years of isolation. Weary from being torn by conflicting information. Weary from war-torn conflict that threatens to destroy our world. Weary because it takes more energy to navigate a day than it used to.

As frustrating as this is, it is not unique in history. This

Christmas you'll probably watch Charles Dickens' *A Christmas Carol.* It was written in a time when there was great poverty; when the poor barely made a living; when people were weary from the cost of living (literally!); when workhouses and orphanages were synonymous; and when large families, high mortality rates, and illness were the norm.

Christ was born into a weary world. King Herod ruled the land with a legacy of ruthlessness. The Romans treated the people of Israel with contempt, imposing harsh taxes and land seizures that forced many into subsistence farming. Poverty and destitution were pervasive. And yet, Christ was born, bringing good news of great joy for all people.

As Advent comes again to a weary world, we ask, "How does a weary world rejoice?" From the opening chapters of Luke's Gospel, we have found a few answers: we acknowledge our weariness, we find joy in connection, we allow ourselves to be amazed, we sing stories of hope, we make room, we root ourselves in ritual, and most importantly, we trust our belovedness.

In the parallel birth stories of Jesus and John, joy arrives—despite trepidation, fear, or grief. In these stories, we find rhythms for rejoicing. As we move through our series, we hope to create space for acknowledging the weariness of our world while celebrating God's closeness with great joy.

And so, this Advent, we will hold space for our weariness and our joy. We will seek a "thrill of hope" in our hurting world. We will welcome joy—even if, like the prophet Isaiah, we cry out for comfort (Isaiah 40:1). In this weary world, may we find many ways to rejoice.

I think of the song, "O Holy Night." The lyrics go, "A thrill of hope, the weary world rejoices, for yonder breaks a new and glorious morn." When Jesus left his throne in heaven and took on flesh (the incarnation), He brought the thrill of hope to a weary world. This hope remains today. It is the hope that we who know Him as Savior have an eternal home, and this is not it. It is a sure hope of victory over death

If you are struggling with weariness or sin this season, I'd like to suggest you ponder what God did on that holy night when our dear Savior was born. Just maybe, you will be caught up in the thrill of hope. Join us at MIPC in person or online as we make space for possibilities, and in them, we find rhythms for rejoicing, even in the midst of difficult circumstances.

This year we will add a special Advent opportunity: A Living Nativity will take place at MIPC on Monday, December 4th at 4pm. Bring your own chairs and watch the older elementary kids and the animals as they bring the nativity to life. Invite your neighbors and friends to join in as we find joy in this new opportunity to experience Jesus and the nativity here at MIPC.

May you have a blessed and meaningful Advent Season.

- Approved Leslie Neihouse as Elder Commissioner for December Presbytery meeting.

- Approved request to move the \$500 budgeted for Brevard Justice Ministry to Mutual Aid Society.
- Approved request to have Change of Greenery guide our volunteers and hire 2 technicians for 2 hrs, twice a year at a cost of \$75/hr for 2 technicians. The cost of these technicians would be paid out of the Memorial Garden Designated Funds. The total cost would be \$300 per year.

Mutual Aid Brevard:

Our November Partner Luncheon was a big success! We had over 30 attendees from agencies all over Brevard come together to share about the programs each of them have to make life better for Brevard folks. We had donations of food for lunch, candles and soaps for each attendee, and gift cards

and other cool donations for door prizes. We will continue to make these luncheons happen on a quarterly basis. It's so valuable to spend time getting to know the people who work in these agencies, and learn how each one is unique.

October spending was mostly hotel and rent assistance, with transportation coming in 2nd (mostly car insurance assistance, which is extremely difficult to find anywhere else.)

As the holidays approach, Mutual Aid is keeping a featured post updated with resources for people to apply for toys for their children or food for their holiday meals; we're also posting ways that folks can help volunteer for some of these agencies that work so hard to meet needs at this time of year.

Much of what a Stephen Minister does is listening without judgement. Confidentiality is key to Stephen Ministry and the care receiver remains anonymous.



Performance dates are Friday, December 8th @ 7:00 p.m. and Saturday, December 9th @ 4:00 p.m.










