

Pastor Christina's Corner



As we lean into the Lenten season, we ready ourselves to celebrate redemption. Though our bodies are destined for dust, in Christ our souls are bound for glory!

Ash Wednesday marks the beginning of Lent, a 40-day period of reflection and renewal in the Christian calendar. This year we will use bread as a way to focus our time together as we Journey towards the cross. Our Lenten theme is *Bread of Life*.

Why bread? Christians have always enjoyed sharing a meal. Meals are rich with biblical symbolism, because they are tangible expressions of service, love, and unity; and because of the opportunity it offers for true fellowship and genuine community. Practically, sharing a meal nourishes our need to know and be known because it facilitates face-to-face conversation.

From God's provision of manna in the wilderness to Jesus' miraculous multiplication of loaves, bread functions throughout Scripture as a sign of God's presence and provision.

Bread of Life: Gather. Savor. Share.

Bread nourishes our body and the Bread of Life nourishes our souls. We need both to feel satiated and we need a reminder of God's goodness, mercy and provision. When the world feels heavy, divided and uncertain. When our hearts ache, minds seek peace, and souls hunger for hope. In these moments, while many search for a way forward, the Bread of Life reminds us of abundance, grace, provision and care. There is enough love, grace, and hope for all.

The Lenten Theme *Bread of Life* highlights how Jesus fed people—not just their bodies, but their souls—with good news, redemption, and stories of God's kin(g)dom. From wedding feasts to eating with tax collectors to feeding thousands, people left Jesus' presence with full hearts and bellies.

As we journey through Lent, from the wilderness to the shorelines of Galilee, we will find the sacred in the ordinary—like bread, simple yet essential. This Lent, gather together to break bread around the table, savor in the divine generosity of God, and rise to share with the world out of the abundance we have received from the Bread of Life.

Remembering the table has long been a symbol of shared meals and a hallmark of community. Sharing meals around the table builds trust, fosters belonging, and addresses our very real need for food and community. From potlucks, picnics, dinner groups, and receptions, to Friday Lenten fish frys, fellowship meals have given people a place to gather and belong.

We have different ways we can break bread together, to journey together and to experience God's grace and provision. We begin on Ash Wednesday with a Souper Supper in the Activities room at 5pm. At our Friday Fellowship, starting at 5pm on Fridays, we break bread together around tables, spending time as God's community and sharing a short time of worship to help center our weekend and to renew our souls after a trying week. On Sundays, after worship we sit together and share together over snacks in the Narthex.

I encourage you to extend an invitation today and begin to develop the kind of rich relationships we were designed to enjoy at our tables. Want to come over and Break Bread?

Message from Hein Vingerling Matthew 28 Orphanage, Bohoc, Haiti

We received this year-end message from Hein:

May this letter reach you in good health and may the New Year 2025 be a year of blessings and contentment for you and all your loved ones.

Thank you very much for the support that you gave to our work in 2024. We have been able to do some wonderful things thanks to your generosity!

We supplied a meal to 1650 children every weekday. We have been able to give some food assistance to some 1500 families who have a child in our feeding center. We pray this will be able to continue for as long as they have no food in their gardens.

You enabled us to educate more than 160 children in our school, which reached its completion this school year, with grades preschool 1 through elementary 6.

You have made it possible that our staff of 23 people in total were able to provide for their families.

You have supported our community activities such as the annual soccer championship which not only gives the community 3 solid weeks of excitement but gives a total of 66 scholarships for the players to help with their school expenses.

YOU HAVE BEEN AWESOME!

Let me not forget the prayers you lifted for our work and the people of Haiti. This has made it possible that our work still continues at a time that many organizations have pulled out.



Mutual Aid Brevard



2024 has ended and 2025 is in full swing! In December and January, and even into February, we had some cold nights. When the temperature drops below 45°, people experiencing homelessness are very vulnerable, so we are grateful there are cold night shelters available.

There are 3 main cold night shelters in our very long county: LifePoint Ministries in Titusville, the Central Brevard Sharing Center in Cocoa, and in Melbourne the city uses a couple

of different facilities, depending on availability. Matthew's Hope in Cocoa will also open up when the temperature drops to a certain point, which is good because the Sharing Center's capacity is not very large. We are grateful to these entities for caring for our unhoused population at these times.

Mutual Aid will turn FIVE years old this March. We were created during the pandemic, and since then we have helped thousands of Brevard residents with needs both big and small (from a \$20 phone bill to a \$2500 rent payment) thanks to the generosity of our donors. If you have not visited the page lately, stop by and read the stories of people offering help, requesting help, meeting needs, sharing information, sharing resources, sharing the love.

Our admins work hard to screen all posts to be sure they comply with our rules and stated mission. We keep an eye on posts to make sure the responses don't get out of hand, and repeat offenders get removed from the group. It's important to keep the group a safe space for people to ask for help.

Stephen Ministry



MIPC has a strong Stephen Ministry program in partnership with Grace United Methodist Church. A Stephen Minister is a lay caregiver providing one-on-one confidential Christian care to the bereaved, hospitalized, terminally ill, divorced, unemployed, relocated, empty nester, and others facing a crisis or life challenge. All Stephen Ministers and care receivers are paired by gender... women with women and men with men.

Stephen Ministers are a vessel for Christ, to be a listening ear and to walk with people during difficult times. It should be stressed that this ministry is God centered. The Stephen Minister provides the care....God provides the healing.

MIPC Stephen Ministers can be identified by their blue name tags which show their names along with "Stephen Minister" on Sunday mornings and any of these Stephen Ministers will gladly answer any questions you may have about the program. 








Men's Bible Study Group with Milt Seapker
