As I write this the weather has gone from nice and comfortable to the need to BLAST the AC. The heat has a way of zapping our strength and making us want to stay inside or migrate to cooler places.

And our snow birds have taken notice of the warmer temperatures and have started their annual migration north. We miss them while they are away and look forward to their return each year.

Our snow bird migration (and the heat) reminds me that soon summer will be here.

Ahhh, summer! Can you taste the lemonade? A time to get away, a time to relax and grab much-needed R & R. Vacations and weekend getaways may keep you away from church, but our congregation is still bustling with activity. The bills and the ministry of MIPC never take a summer holiday.

It's enormously helpful to the congregation's balance sheet if your gifts, tithes and offerings continue to come in regularly, even if you are away. Here are some ideas for staying current:

- ◆ Pay in advance: Plan ahead by offering more in the weeks in advance of your time away from church.
- ◆ Make it up: When you return, give a little more in the weeks that follow.
- ◆ Use banking bill pay: Most online banking services will write and send checks for you. Just plug in the church address, the amount of the gift and how often you want it sent. Viola! You're done!
- ◆ Enroll in electronic giving: Use the congregation's online giving portal to regularize your gift, tithe or offering.
- ◆ Give monthly, quarterly, or annually: Sometimes it's hard to anticipate how many Sundays you'll be away from church. Planning your gift, tithe or offering for monthly or quarterly can keep you current.

Of course, these methods are beneficial not only for the summer months, but also for the whole year through. Those who embrace giving as a spiritual discipline often find that their lives of faith are enriched and their sense of joy and fulfillment is deepened. Choosing a regular giving strategy can help you to discover the joys of generosity.

It is through your kindness and generosity that we continue to be able to be a beacon of hope and love within our community! I continue to be amazed at how active our church campus is with our preschool, those who use our Fellowship Hall (Scouts, AA, Square Dancers, Christ the King Church), and our own ministries (Kids Klub, One Purpose, and special events). Rarely is there a day when there is not activity of some sort at MIPC.

As we prepare to welcome the summer, may we continue to remember how our gifts and offerings help to provide welcome to those in our community.

All our renovations are completed and the Preschool looks amazing, with new roofs, new paint, and new bathrooms throughout.

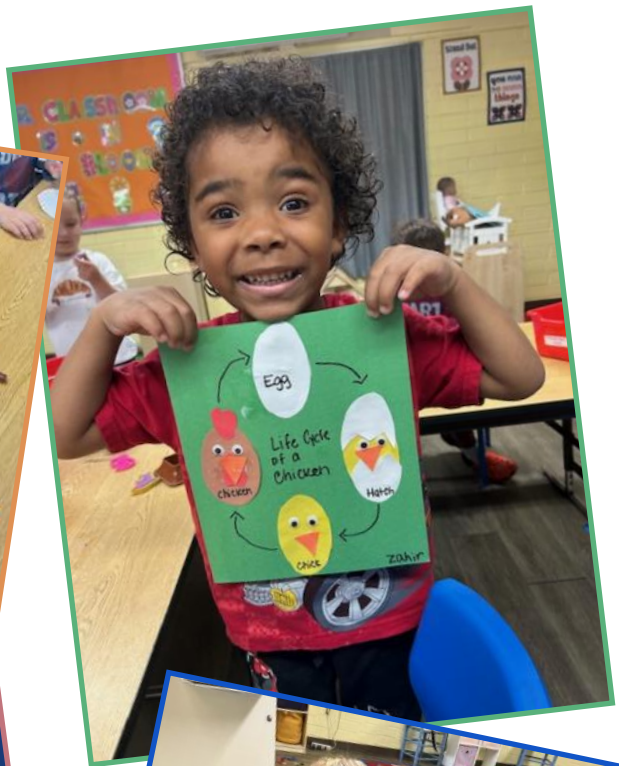

March 23rd marked the joyful return of choir rehearsals after worship, as we began preparations for Easter. That morning also brought a "Spontaneous Confetti Moment" (and a valuable lesson for me on the proper way to carry a three-hole punch). Many thanks to Craig Hill for swooping in and saving the sanctuary from becoming a work of modern art!

On March 30th, we were blessed by a moving rendition of Amazing Grace on the clarinet, beautifully performed by John Shuford.

On April 6th, we gathered at the Lord's Table for communion to prepare our hearts for the upcoming sacred journey through Holy Week.

Palm Sunday (April 13th) was a joyful and vibrant celebration, filled with palm fronds and fresh greenery from Pastor Christina's own yard. The service was made even more special by the musical gifts of John Shuford on clarinet, accompanied by Joyce Walker on piano.

On Maundy Thursday (April 17th), we shared in a reflective Service of Shadows and communion by intinction (with unleavened bread made by Pastor Christina using salt and honey from our own church community), honoring the deep mystery of Christ's final meal with his disciples.

The Good Friday prayer service on April 18th was an intimate and powerful time of worship. In an echo of the first witnesses to the resurrection, the service was attended solely by women—except for Dale, our devoted sound technician, who we named an honorary woman for the day.

Dear friends: Greetings!

This is a bittersweet letter to write. It is our last letter to you as PC(USA) mission co-workers serving with PC(USA)'s partner church in Madagascar, the Church of Jesus Christ in Madagascar (FJKM).

As many of you may know, PC(USA) merged the Office of General Assembly with the Presbyterian Mission Agency into the Interim Unified Agency (IUA) in October 2024. This has led to the restructuring of some PC(USA) ministries. The IUA is embarking on a new pattern for global engagement with PC(USA)'s international partners. PC(USA) will no longer be sending mission co-workers as all mission co-worker positions have concluded. Some mission co-workers have been invited to participate in the new model where global ecumenical liaisons will interact with PC (USA)'s international partners. Sadly, we ended service on March 24, 2025.

Despite our sadness in concluding our time as PC(USA) mission co-workers, we give thanks for all that has been accomplished and for your faithful commitment to supporting the former Presbyterian Mission Agency (now the IUA), us, and the FJKM over these many years. FJKM's approach to mission is holistic. For the FJKM, preaching the Gospel goes hand in hand with meeting the needs of the people. We began serving with the FJKM in 1996 in response to FJKM's request to PC(USA) for health and environmental specialists. Since then, we have worked alongside FJKM colleagues to design and carry out programs to address the health concerns, poverty, and biodiversity crisis facing the people and country of Madagascar. Here's a small snapshot of what we (you, the FJKM, the former Presbyterian Mission Agency (now the IUA) staff, including Dan and Elizabeth) have been able to do together

over the last two decades:

- Helping train personnel and equip over 40 FJKM rural dispensaries for 20 years
- Accompanying the FJKM AIDS & Epidemics Committee as it fights the spread of HIV and COVID
- Helping the Antanetibe community get out of poverty by growing tangerines
- Establishing the Mango Palace, a fruit tree center for training farmers in fruit tree production and propagation using some of the world's best fruit tree varieties
- Promoting native trees and working around protected areas to help protect Madagascar's unique biodiversity
- Building water catchment systems and supporting schools in southern Madagascar

Ministering with you and the PC(USA) by living here in Madagascar and taking part in the daily joys and struggles that the church and people face has been an honor. We have learned so much about what it means to be a faithful follower of Christ from our FJKM siblings in Christ. Witnessing the joy of Christians in southern Madagascar whose lives are so difficult has deepened our understanding of what the joy of the Lord really means. We hope you have been inspired as you have heard about the lives and faithfulness of the FJKM and its members and partnered with them.

We encourage you to continue partnering with the FJKM and supporting its ministries. The Madagascar Mission Network is a Presbyterian network of churches and others who support the ministries of the FJKM. Being a part of the Madagascar Mission Network is a wonderful way to support the FJKM and keep up to date on its ministries.

Please be in prayer for the FJKM as it holds its General Assembly this August in southern Madagascar. Please continue to pray for the people of Madagascar as the poverty rate continues to increase.

For the present, we are continuing to serve with the FJKM at its request. Please pray for us as we discern long-term plans. One great joy coming up is our son Robert's wedding to Tatiana Gonzalez on May 18th in Chicago. Prayers for the wedding are also appreciated. ## **Family Promise of Brevard (FP)**

We're continuing to plan our next FP hosting which will be September 28-October 5, helping to shelter Brevard's homeless families.

Cheryl was an overnight chaperone with our partner church, Grace Methodist, as they hosted during Easter Week. And she can report that Family Promise is back in full swing and there were three lovely families. So...we should expect several families, not just one like we had last January.

A nice development for MIPC's FP is that before September our less-than-attractive carpet in the Activities Room should be replaced with new flooring. We are also getting rid of unneeded things in the closets in the Activities Room so there will be a place for all those huge FP plastic bins. Right now they are mostly on top of the cabinets in the workroom and they are heavy to get down!

## **Sharing Center of Central Brevard**

Due to the ongoing Federal Government reorganization, vital funding for The Second Harvest Food Bank has been eliminated. Second Harvest is a crucial supplier of low-cost grocery and produce items to the Sharing Center of Central Brevard. Moving forward, they will strive to cover 50% of our food pantry requirements. However, The Emergency Food Assistance Program (TEFAP), which many of our clients rely on, will be eliminated immediately. This cut is severe. In 2024 alone, demand for this program surged by over 51%, to 3,254 clients and now, families who depend on it are left vulnerable. Though we are working to secure alternative food sources, we need your help now to bridge this gap.

Here at MIPC, we contribute to the Sharing Center through our budgeted donations, and also the box in the Narthex that is always open for your non-perishable food donations. There is a note by the box that outlines the most urgent food needs for the Center.

Thank you for your continued support of this worthy mission.

March saw a positive result for both Church (+6981 for the month) and Preschool (+2382). This reduces the year's Preschool deficit and increases the Church's year to date surplus.

We expect to have some air conditioning replacement costs in the coming months, as summer approaches and AC is a priority. At least some of the funds for these projects will come from our endowment accounts.

We are pleased that final payment has been made to Macik Builders, which means our renovations to the Fellowship Hall and Preschool buildings (plumbing, bathrooms, and painting) are complete. We appreciate everyone's patience throughout our roofing and renovation projects! The result is a more beautiful campus and a much lower monthly water bill.

# Legacy Giving

## **Leave gifts to benefit Presbyterian congregations, ministries and causes.**

Wills and other forms of legacy giving are essential components of estate planning – the process of managing your accumulated assets and determining what legacy you will leave through them, including your legacy of faith. The Foundation offers planning tools to help donors compose their legacy giving plans and to help churches support these efforts.

### *Did You Know?*

- ◆ Wills and other estate planning documents provide an ideal opportunity to make a statement of faith and to give resources that will support your church or favorite mission for years to come.
- ◆ Suggested language is available that can help you add a bequest to your will easily (but you should consult your attorney before altering your will).
- ◆ Programs for pastors and congregations are available that will help you discuss estate planning in meaningful ways.

If you're ready to create your will as part of your estate plan, the Presbyterian Foundation has sample language and other information that you may find helpful. (These documents are designed to help you get started, but they don't replace a consultation with an experienced attorney.)

Once you've designated a ministry or congregation as a beneficiary in your will, you should notify your church or the other organization that they will be receiving a gift from you after your death. You may wish to give specific instructions on how you'd like to see the funds used. You should also share this news with your family so that they are aware of your wishes.
