- **Youth:** This month, we look forward to the Graduation of our VPK class and we celebrate with Carrie Mills who has grown up through the Preschool and is now graduating from UNF in Jacksonville. On May 1st and 2nd our One Purpose Youth will take the stage once again to share their talents.

Facing the Numbers with Faith

While our hearts are full, our financial outlook requires our collective attention. We are currently navigating a roughly \$65,000 deficit budget (Church and Preschool combined) for 2026. Just as we journey through the liturgy, we remember that "grace does not draw boundaries," but it does call us to responsible action and stewardship.

To bridge this gap while maintaining our outreach—from Stephen Ministry partnerships to supporting children through the MIPC Preschool—we must look at how we can each contribute to our shared vision and mission.

Living Our Mission Through Generosity

At Merritt Island Presbyterian Church, we describe ourselves as an "imperfect but loved and forgiven family of faith." This honesty is our strength. It allows us to face our challenges—including our current budget deficit—not with fear, but with the confidence of a family that looks after one another.

To sustain the vibrant life of our congregation and close this gap, we look to the four pillars of our mission statement:

1. Worshiping Sincerely & Connecting People

Our sanctuary is a place where we connect people to God and each other. From the music that lifts our spirits to the prayers that sustain us, worship requires resources. Closing this deficit ensures our doors remain open and our technology stays current, allowing us to reach those who cannot join us in person.

2. Growing through Spirit-Guided Teaching

Discipleship is a lifelong journey. Your stewardship supports our Faith Enrichment, VBS, and adult Bible studies. To "grow in love," we must invest in the materials and leadership that foster spiritual maturity for the next generation of our faith family.

3. Sharing Grace Generously

Our mission calls us to share God's grace through mercy, hospitality, and service. Whether it's feeding the hungry in our local community or providing a place of refuge and hospitality on the Island, our budget is the engine behind our outreach. We cannot share what we do not sustain.

How You Can Help:

- **Reflect and Pray:** Prayer is a vital component of spiritual stewardship. In your prayers, ask how God is calling you and equipping you to support our mission financially. If you haven't yet made a commitment for this year, your first-time gift is a powerful affirmation of faith and of confidence in our future.
- **Consistent Giving:** Small, regular contributions—like our 5 Cents Per Meal habit—make a significant impact over time. Imagine if we each not only put 5 cents per meal in a can, but what if we each give an extra \$1 a day – with an average attendance at church of 50, that would mean an extra \$18k a year.
- **Active Participation:** Beyond financial gifts, your presence in Adult Faith Enrichment Class (Sunday at 9:00 AM on Zoom or in-person), the Men's or Women's Bible Studies and our Live Stream services keeps our community strong. As you go out into the community bring a sticker or two to share and let people know that MIPC is an open, inclusive and welcoming church where they can find a place of belonging.

- Invite a friend: Recently we talked about how many in our community feel isolated. Come to our game days, Joyful Thursdays, and bring a friend, allowing others a safe way to get involved and form relationships at the church. Invite one of your “crafty” friends to Heavenly Handmade. Bring a friend to a Fellowship event or the One Purpose Show.

We believe that connection is sacred. By addressing this deficit together, we ensure that MIPC remains a place where hope and community continue to thrive for years to come.

We are a people of grace. By giving generously, we aren't just balancing a spreadsheet; we are witnessing to the depth and authenticity of our faith and ensuring that MIPC remains a lighthouse of hope, mercy, and love on Merritt Island.

Communion on May 3

On May 3, we will celebrate the Sacrament of the Lord's Supper during our worship service. Celebrating the Sacrament on the 5th Sunday of Easter invites a particular devotional focus: as we receive the cup of Christ's new covenant, we remember that in doing so we are called to be "a chosen people, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, God's special possession, that [we] may declare the praises of him who called [us] out of darkness into his wonderful light" (1 Peter 2:9). Guest vocalist Sarah Lawrence will bless us with her offering of special music on this date!

Mother's Day!

May 10 is Mother's Day, so we will offer prayers of thanksgiving for our mothers, and for strong women of faith who have been mothers to us and have influenced our lives in so many ways. Join us in the Activities Room after worship for cake and coffee.

Special Music on May 17

We will be richly blessed on the third Sunday of May when Leslie Mitchell and her longtime friend and musical collaborator Shelly McLoney combine their extraordinary talents to grace our worship with special music. Do not miss this!

Day of Pentecost

The Day of Pentecost falls this year on May 24. The name Pentecost comes from the Greek Pentékosté which means fiftieth and originally referred to the Jewish Shavuot (Feast of Weeks) which occurs seven weeks after Passover. The Hebrew festival celebrated the receiving of the Law at Mt. Sinai (Exodus 19-20). The Christian observance recalls and celebrates the receiving of the Holy Spirit by the Apostles and other believers "on the day of Pentecost" as described in Acts 2. We cherish Pentecost Sunday as the "birthday" of the Church, and we use the color red to symbolize the "tongues of fire that separated and came to rest on each of them" (Acts 2:3) on that day.

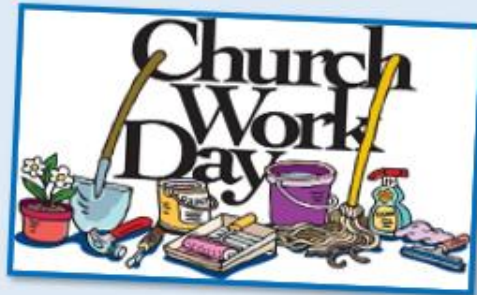
Trinity Sunday is May 31

Church Family Spotlight

Caroline “Carrie” Mills’ journey is a beautiful reflection of how a community can help shape a life from its very earliest days—and how those roots continue to guide new beginnings.

Carrie’s story with Merritt Island Presbyterian Church began when she was just two months old, entering our preschool as an infant. From those first days, she grew up within these walls, learning, playing, and forming the earliest foundations of who she would become. She remained in the preschool until age five, carrying with her not only early education but also the warmth and care of a church family that watched her grow.

As the years went on, Carrie stayed connected. She returned to help at the preschool alongside her mom, Robyn Mills (now the preschool director), offering the same care and attention she once received. She joined in summer camps when she could, participated in Vacation Bible School, and was part of Kids Klub in sixth grade. Her presence was a constant thread—sometimes as a student, sometimes as a helper, always as part of the MIPC family.

In 2019, Carrie officially stepped into a working role at the preschool, helping with behind-the-scenes tasks like cleaning classrooms and bathrooms—work that often goes unnoticed but is essential to creating a safe and welcoming space for others. By 2022, during her school breaks, she expanded her role by assisting in classrooms, pouring into the next generation of children just as others once poured into her.

Now, Carrie graduates from Florida Atlantic University with a degree in business management—an incredible milestone that reflects years of dedication and growth. And in true adventurous spirit, she is preparing for her next chapter: moving to Australia to gain life experience and explore the world beyond what she has always known.

Her journey brings to mind the words of scripture:

“Trust in the Lord with all your heart and lean not on your own understanding; in all your ways submit to Him, and He will make your paths straight.” ~Proverbs 3:5–6

While her path is taking her far from Merritt Island, her story remains deeply rooted here. From a two-month-old infant in the preschool to a young woman stepping confidently into the world, Carrie’s journey is a testament to faith, community, and the enduring impact of a loving foundation. Wherever life takes her, Carrie will always have a place to call home at Merritt Island Presbyterian Church.

Madagascar Update

Dear Friends,

I had hoped to keep you better updated on happenings in Madagascar. You may remember we have a 25+ year relationship with Dan and Elizabeth Turk...and I promise to do better!

First bit of information is that the Turks are in the States (for their daughter Frances' wedding) and will be here probably until October. We hope to have them in our pulpit in August or September so they can fill us in on progress and happenings. Fortunately their connections with the 6 million-member FJKM church and the Malagasy people will keep them in touch with happenings. You perhaps know that every month I am part of the Madagascar Mission Network (MMN) meetings which are attended by people from all over the world!

As to the government we learned in March that there were 30 government ministers appointed, men and women, who hope to lead their country away from the rampant corruption and be "serving the people, not special interests." Colonel Michael Randrianirina who is the acting president seems to be working to root out the problems that have plagued Madagascar for decades.

But there is confusion about the Gen Z group that spearheaded the October 2025 takeover which ran out the former president Andry—no one quite knows who Gen Z is. In the past they were cast as disgruntled and well organized students but no one seems to be quite sure. There is also the concern about Colonel Michael's visit to Moscow where he met with Putin. The Russians gave Madagascar armored vehicles, weapons, ammunition, and uniforms on April 1, a visible strengthening of the Russian presence in the country.

Mission/Outreach

But on a happier note, in the next newsletter I will share with you a picture of the beautiful new small elementary school our two recent mission groups are responsible for—it will save the children who live close to the Mango Palace (where Dan has most of his plants) from a dangerous long walk to the government school along one of the few very busy roads. It will be a FJKM school which has much higher standards for their students.

If you have questions about Madagascar please ask me! If you want to be more involved we would love to have you join the MMN.

I hope at some point to give a Sunday morning presentation of Fred's and my trip which we took with 4 members of the 1st Presbyterian Church of Tuscaloosa.

Recycle



Don't forget about our paper recycling bin at the southeast corner of the parking lot. Remember to bring your newspapers, magazines, junk mail, scrap paper, and paper bags to the bin regularly. When market prices allow, the recycle company shares some of their profit with us—but either way, your efforts are helping keep paper waste out of the landfill!

Please—these items are **not allowed in the bin**:

- ◆ Plastic Bags
- ◆ Cardboard of any kind
- ◆ Any type of food waste
- ◆ Glass or metal

Clothing Bin



Remember, there is a clothing collection shed on our property, near the paper recycling bin. The company collecting the clothing is St. Pauly Textile, which is a for-profit organization that collects clothing all over the country and then sells in bulk to organizations who will redistribute the clothing, such as the US government (FEMA), foreign governments, and relief agencies.

The shed is monitored and emptied every week. There are two advantages to MIPC for this setup:

1. We are paid 4 cents for every pound of clothing collected
2. We get first dibs on any clothing dropped off, so we can use it for any of our ministries here at MIPC.

We encourage you to bring in used clothing (it must be bagged in plastic bags). They will also accept shoes, belts, purses, blankets, sheets, curtains, pillowcases and stuffed animals.

The March financial report reflects steady progress in our shared ministry. The church recorded a positive balance of \$1,086, while the preschool showed a temporary deficit of \$1,180 due to the unplanned expense of playground mulch replacement. While partial funds were raised, the remaining cost was expensed; without this infrequent expense (every 3-4 years), the preschool would also have ended the month with a positive result. (The “Mulch Madness” special collection remains open, for those who still would like to contribute.)

At the close of the first quarter, both the church and preschool are tracking close to budget expectations. Pledge income is in line with projections, while some other income sources are slightly behind. Expenses for both ministries remain generally consistent with the budget.

While this alignment reflects careful stewardship, it also means we remain on track for the planned combined deficit of \$65,209. In the months ahead, we will prayerfully consider ways to strengthen generosity, grow income, and manage expenses in support of our mission.

Finance

In May, we will welcome a representative from the Presbyterian Foundation to guide us in areas such as stewardship, generosity, legacy giving, and facility usage. The Finance Committee will be meeting with him on May 21 at 6:00 PM, followed by a presentation from him at the next Session meeting on May 27.

It is a privilege to serve in this role and to support the stewardship of our church's resources. If you would like to join the Finance Committee or even just attend the next meeting via Zoom on May 21st — please feel free to reach out.

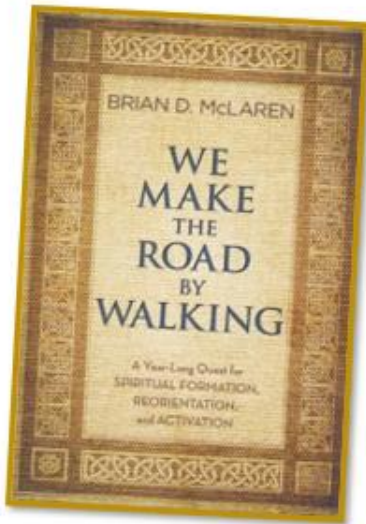

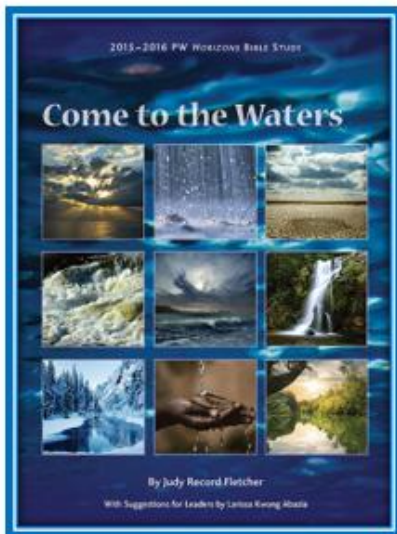
