Family Promise Update

Family Promise of Brevard (familypromiseofbrevard.org), as you almost surely know, is one of our community's efforts to help homeless families with children. Over a dozen churches and synagogues participate.

The quarterly meeting May 18th that Cheryl attended gave many of us a place to share information and work toward solutions to glitches in the program.

Most of the families that we at MIPC knew and others who we didn't get to meet personally, are now successfully housed... except for the family of 7. They far exceeded the maximum of 100 days in the program and are now working things out on their own. While in the program both parents were able to find jobs and get their car fixed. We hope they know we are praying for them to succeed.

Another disappointment this quarter was having to let the coordinator go. Until that position is filled FP will limit families to 2 instead of the potential 4. Mike Hoenig will have to do double duty for a while but he thinks he has a promising candidate right now.

Most of the meeting was devoted to discussion of the much-anticipated Static Site in Merritt Island (across from Jefferson Middle School) where multiple families can stay unsupervised if there are no churches scheduled to house them. It had appeared to be a painless answer to a prayer but as with most things, there were issues. Who would be responsible for keeping things cleaned up? Who would make sure the meals dropped off for them would be properly refrigerated? And that everything is marked with dates and names? Would all the families get along in a nice house but with four bedrooms and only two bathrooms?

Among the things we learned: let the families unwind a bit when they come home for supper.

A new set of expectations will be written up for the families when they are in the Static Site which will differ from the expectations when in churches.

Mission/Outreach

The current Static Site is probably FP's until 2027 and there is a possibility of a Static Site in Cocoa Beach. As can be imagined, the Static Sites save huge amounts of money and also—in contrast to housing in hotels— they make it easier for us to get to know and interact with the families.

Looking at the hosting calendar through December of 2026 there will be many weeks when the Static Site is in use. During those times it works out beautifully if a single church will take over the meals for a full week.

I think MIPC can do that and will pursue that offer if I can get 6 people (I will do the 7th supper) to say they will feed the families for one night during the week.

Please let us know if you think that this is a good idea and can help.

Ending on a happy note, the one family who entered the program with a cat (not supposed to happen) were happy that someone fostered their kitty until they were free to rehome her with them.

MIPC's next scheduled housing is September 20-27, 2026. Counting on our wonderful volunteers to pitch in again!



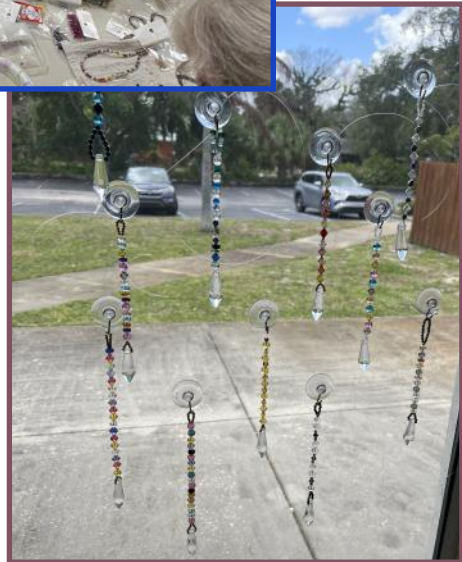

Presbyterians for Earth Care June Webinar Climate Migrants: Neglected Victims of Climate Injustice

WEBINAR DATE: Tuesday, June 9, 2026

TIME: 7:30 pm Eastern / 6:30 Central

PRESENTER: Dr. Paul Clements, Western Michigan University

In recent years the United Nations, the European Union, the US government, and the media have indicated that there could be 200 million people displaced from their homes and livelihoods by effects of climate change by the year 2050, but my research finds that 500 million is a more likely estimate. This would be about 5% of Earth's population.

Global responses to climate change have always been inadequate and today international cooperation generally and development assistance in particular are in deep crisis. Nevertheless, it is important to aim for climate justice. This presentation will address five topics:

- (1) international cooperation on climate change since 1992 and its neglect of climate migrants,
- (2) estimates of potential climate migration through 2050,
- (3) the problematic focus of the American climate justice movement on injustices within the US,
- (4) the stronger global government needed to address the climate crisis, and
- (5) how Americans could take responsibility for impacts of our carbon pollution.

The April financial report reflects ongoing cash flow challenges for both the church and preschool ministries. The church reported a monthly operating deficit of approximately \$3,839, with a year-to-date deficit of \$14,474. The preschool reported a monthly deficit of approximately \$3,217 and a year-to-date deficit of \$19,141.

In May, to help maintain cash flow, remaining funds in the preschool's investment account as well as an additional amount from the church's New Covenant - General Fund investment account were transferred to the preschool checking account so the preschool could pay a couple of months' worth of payable amounts owed to the church, so that then the church would be able to handle the second payday in May and other remaining May expenses.

It should be noted that, with both the church and the preschool having deficit budgets, it is not ideal but also not surprising that monies will sometimes have to come out of savings/investment accounts to pay for operating expenses, like in this month's situation.

Finance

On that note, at the May Finance Committee meeting, we were joined by the Rev. Dana Waters, our Ministry Relations Officer with the Presbyterian Foundation. Dana shared several ways that he and the Foundation might be able to assist us, with one way being Project Regeneration, a program focused on helping churches discern mission and ministry priorities for the purpose of revitalization. From a financial perspective, this program could assist us with stewardship, budgeting, and developing additional sources of income. Dana will be speaking soon to Session about this and other programs, and Session will determine whether our participation in this free program might be what we need to amend our current course.

As always, thank you for your continued prayers, generosity, and faithful support of the ministries of Merritt Island Presbyterian Church.

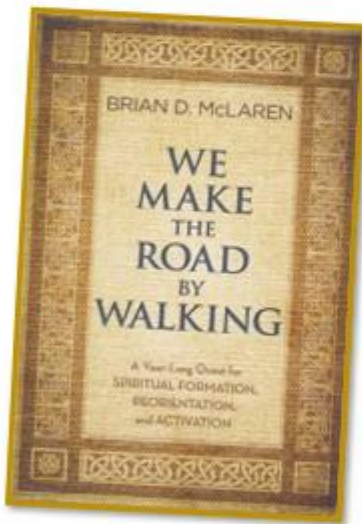

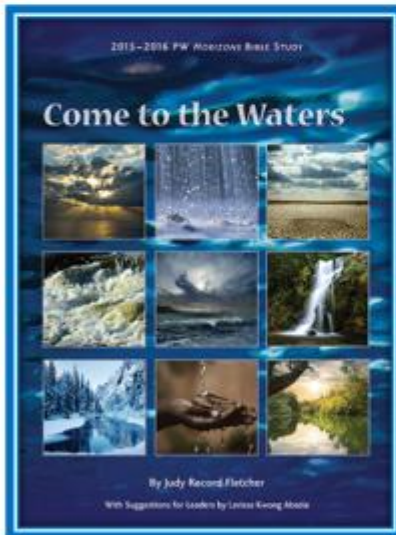

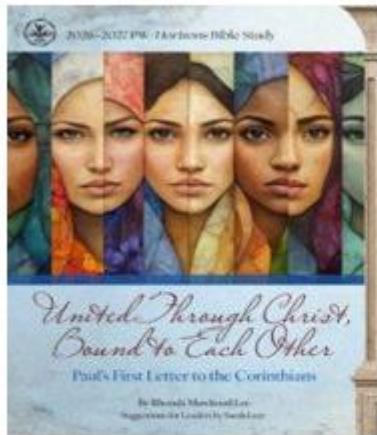
