

November 11 - "It's About the Family" <u>Scripture</u>: Ephesians 5:21-6:21


November 18 - "It's About the Gift" <u>Scripture</u>: Matthew 20:20-28

As I watch the leaves change color and fall to the ground, I am amazed again at the beauty of God's creation. This season reminds me to be thankful for all of the

blessings that God has provided in my life. I Thessalonians 5:18: "Give thanks in all circumstances, for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus." Everyday, we can find at least one thing for which to be grateful.

In fact, it has been scientifically proven that gratitude is the absolute healthiest emotion that you can have, right along with generosity. Studies have shown that people who are generous and grateful are far more resistant to disease and illness than people who are grumpy and grouchy. Your attitude toward life makes a huge difference!

There is incredible power in thanksgiving. It has the power to transform seemingly unsolvable problems. When you learn to thank and to praise God in the midst of a problem, in the midst of a pain, in the midst of a crisis, God often does a miracle and turns things around. Gratitude is a miracle-creating attitude!

The story in Acts 16 is a perfect example. Paul and Silas have gone to Philippi to preach and to teach. They weren't well-received. In fact, the crowd stoned them and then beat them up. They took Paul and Silas and threw them beaten and bruised into prison. At midnight, in the middle of the dark, cold prison, Paul and Silas decided to start thanking God. They started praising and rejoicing in God. They began to sing songs of thanksgiving.

Guess what? God did a miracle! He sent an earthquake and the whole prison started shaking, so much that all the prison cell doors opened and the chains on the prisoners came unbound. They were all set free. You see, freedom comes through thanksgiving. Peace comes through thanksgiving. Joy comes through thanksgiving. Miracles come through thanksgiving. Abundance comes through thanksgiving.

What is it that's got you bound up these days? Fear about your finances? Worry about a relationship? Conflict? Despair? Depression? Guilt? Whatever it is, start thanking God in the middle of that situation. Watch the attitude of gratitude do a miracle in your life. It releases the power of God. Instead of complaining about your problems, start counting your blessings. Instead of looking at what you've lost, start looking at what you have left.

As we prepare to celebrate Thanksgiving this month and gather with friends and family, really ponder the question: **What am I most grateful for this year?** Health? Food? Friends? Job? Perhaps you can even be grateful for God's purposes behind the challenges you might be facing. God is always working in our hearts, sometimes in ways that surprise and amaze us!
