In Lovett Weems' book entitled "Bearing Fruit," there is a story in the second chapter that I thought was worth repeating. United Methodist Pastor Andy Bryan writes, "I was preaching on God's mission... and then moved on to a more specific focus talking about how the church is the body of Christ in the world today, sent on the

same mission Jesus Christ was sent on. When we lose sight of that mission and start focusing on other things, we lose our connection to God and become just another social organization among many.

I then asked the congregation, "If someone came up to you this week and asked you, 'Why does your church exist?' what would you say?" The responses were slow to start off, but they began to come after a while. "To connect people together." "To share the love of God with others." "To offer Christ to people." And then, in a quiet but confident ten-year-old voice from the middle of the room: "To change the world."

His response hung in the air; the Holy Spirit was palpable in the room at that moment. Whispers could be heard as the grown-ups asked one another who had brought the sermon to a halt with a burst of Holy Spirit inspired truth. Andy reflects, "For a few moments there, I literally could not go on. The sermon was irrelevant, insignificant fluff. Power had been spoken aloud, and I did not know how to proceed. What more needs to be said when a ten-year-old believes that his church exists to change the world?"

I thought that this story was incredibly powerful. It is a good question to ponder: Why does our church exist? How would you answer the question? What phrases or wording comes to mind? We are on a mission to reach out and share the love of Christ. We seek to be a "beacon of hope" to those in our community by pointing them to Jesus. We want to offer a faith that works in real life, that matters, that makes a difference.

May this be our prayer: *Gracious God, we truly want to help those in need in our community and world.* We desire for everyone to come to know Christ. We know that we cannot step out in such mission and service without the presence and power of your Holy Spirit in our lives. Help us as we move forward in our task of reaching out to our community, knowing that we, your church, exist not for ourselves but for others. In the name of Jesus Christ, our Lord and Savior, Amen.

I look forward to a terrific summer together as we seek to grow deeper in our walk with Jesus and to invite others to join our community of faith. Please be in prayer as we plant the seeds of the gospel in the summer sun. Pray that they will bloom and grow in the hearts of many people. Also, think of a friend, neighbor, or family member that you could invite to come to worship with you. Personal invitation is the best advertising!

May God be honored by all that we do this summer and may the grace and love of Jesus flow through our hands as we serve and work together.

This corporation is a not-for-profit human services organization which was created to help residents of Gratiot County meet sudden and unexpected home-related expenses in a time of need, when other sources of funding fall short, such as security deposits for new apartments, utility shut off notices, past due rent, wheel chair ramps, bathroom handrails, and so on. GEHC offers a hand up, not a handout. Funding is limited, so people receiving interest-free assistance from GEHC will be asked to sign a repayment agreement so that together we may help others.
