

Next Lord's Day, we will celebrate the Sacrament of Holy Communion

Jesus says,

I myself am he who searches mind and heart, and I will give to each of you according to your works. ~Revelation 2:23

Jesus is the one who *searches the mind and heart* of his people, but then he also judges everyone *according to your works*.

Why does he make the internal inspection if he is going to judge according to one's behavior? Which is it? The disposition of our heart, or our external actions?

The only correct answer is 'Yes.' Jesus judges us as whole people – our external actions and the internal disposition of our heart.

We must have a heart of faith, because *without faith it is impossible to please him.* (Hebrews 11:6) We have to believe God, to embrace his covenant promises from the heart. We must believe in Jesus with a mind and heart renewed by the Holy Ghost.

But at the same time we must have works done in obedience, because faith by itself, if it does not have works, is dead.... You believe that God is one; you do well. Even the demons believe – and shudder! (James 2:17, 19)

What Jesus says to us in Revelation 2 not different from what Jesus shows us in the Sermon on the Mount. Our intentions and our actions must line up.

This is the way of a true and lively faith. We must repent and believe in the Gospel (Mark 1:15). And, having repented and believed, our faith must manifest itself in holy obedience through deeds done for the right reasons, with the right motive. This is the Christian way: faith active along with works, a faith completed by works. (James 2:22)

Only then do we know what it really means to glorify God and to enjoy him forever.
