We have much to thank God for and much to ask him.

God Miraculously Protected Our City and Campus!

Officials reported <u>no casualties</u>. Students were out of town on Spring Break. Several student housing buildings and academic buildings received extensive damage. The campus is closed until at least April 2. We still do not know what the rest of the semester will look like for students. The Hightower home will need a new roof and ceiling, but we experienced much less damage than many of our neighbors.

Around 8:30pm on Monday, we woke our children and brought them into our master closet. The weather had been severe for a while, but we decided to take cover when we heard tornado sirens. Just before we lost power, we learned that the tornado was on Highway 204 headed our way. I stood outside the closet until I heard the freight train-like approach of the tornado. We shut the door, huddled our kids together, and prayed: "Lord Jesus, please protect us. Please have mercy." And He did.

Even now, recounting these few minutes from a couple days ago, I can feel my adrenaline rise. Once the sun rose, we were able to assess the damage and contact students. I texted every student I have met in the past year and heard back from many that they were safe or out of town. We quickly realized that our quiet neighborhood had turned into a war zone-chainsaws running, emergency vehicles policing the streets, helicopters flying overhead, and authority officials preventing entry without proof of residency.

Thank you to all who texted, called, or contacted us through social media. Thank you to others who provided food and a place to live. We will need volunteers in the weeks to come. Please contact me through email or my cell phone (334-372-0621) if you are interested in helping with the cleanup.

Please pray:

- For students who have lost many material possessions and have been displaced by the weather. They are frustrated and worried because they can't get back on campus until next month. Pray for peace and patience.
- For the faculty and staff at JSU as they begin the long rebuilding and adjusting process.
- For first responders, construction workers, and other professionals who are faced with a massive need, even in the midst of dealing with damage to their own homes.
- Pray for us, RUF, and other ministries as we care for students and others in the wake of this disaster.

We cannot thank you enough for partnering with us so that RUF can be here in the midst of these hurting students offering them the hope of the gospel. 
